Mike's Musings

Life is hard! There is no question about how hard it can be. I'm sure you can agree. Most of the time it's hard because we make it hard but take heart God has given us the answers to help us navigate the troubles of this life. God desires to fully saturate

every part of us to help. God starts with our minds, flowing into our hearts, shaping our words, and ultimately transforming our actions. We first must get on board with God's plan for any of this to happen.

First, God begins with our minds. Romans 12:2 says: "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." We find renewal of our minds in reading God's word, but don't just read it, memorize it, repeat it aloud, write it down, and then ponder it to see what God is saying to you.

Second, God works on our heart. Psalm 51:10 says: "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me." Having a clean heart (or repentant heart) puts us back where God wants us to be, full in the Spirit. Sin affects our relationship with God. We want to always ask God to examine our heart to be sure we are being faithful and obedient to Him.

Third, God wants our words to be about Him. Matthew 12:34b says: "Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks." You can see that if we are in God's word our mind is right, and if our minds are right our hearts will follow, then our words should reflect God.

Fourth, God helps guide our actions. Matthew 5:16 says: "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your father in heaven." Isn't this how we show others by being the light?

God has a great plan if we want to have a better life. We need to learn that the same boiling water that softens the potato hardens the egg. It's about what you're made of, not the circumstance. So, when life gets hard remember God is helping renew your mind, make your heart right, guides your words, and helps you reflect Him in your actions. You have to take part in this, but you're not alone. God has a plan follow it.

The Church of the Straits Community Food Pantry has been very busy providing essential food to those experiencing food insecurity within our community.

Through dedicated volunteer efforts and community donations, the Pantry continues to fulfill its mission of offering nutritional food assistance to those in need. We are averaging around feeding 27 to 36 families every two weeks. Christmas was our biggest pantry feeding 100 people, plus all those who have children received toys to put under their Christmas tree, so no child got up Christmas morning without a gift.

We are concentrating on praying with each family and because of this some of our attendees are now attending Church and one family will be joining. God has surely blessed us. All praise and glory to our Lord.

#### **Helping Hands for Jesus in 2024**

We started off the year by changing the name of our group from the Willing Workers to "Helping Hands for Jesus". Our ladies have been very busy this year with funerals, helping Shannon with many of the activities she planned for the children. Halloween was a rainy day, but it didn't stop the trick or treaters. We made cakes for the Easter Bunny Luncheon. Christian books out to children and adults at the Memorial Day Parade. Had a Salad Luncheon for the ladies in our community, 100 ladies attended.

I was looking at some pictures the other day in preparation for a presentation at the Library concerning Church of the Straits.
