Mike's Musings

Inspiration comes from unlikely sources sometimes. I went to see the movie "Jesus Revolution" and was inspired. There was a scene where this pastor of a failing church saw a news broadcast with hippies protesting and he said, "They just

need a bath and a haircut." He was really put off by the way they looked. He later got to meet a hippie who was a Jesus follower and had a change of heart. Soon after that he invited the hippie and his friends to his church, and they filled it up. The members of the church were not pleased and told him that the hippies were getting their new carpet dirty with their dirty feet. So, the next week the pastor met everyone at the door, and he washed their feet before they came into the church. Of course, the crowd in the movie theater cheered, but I cried a little. You see it got me thinking about who I might be writing off because I don't like how they look, or how they believe, or how they act or even how they talk.

In 2 Corinthians 5:17 it says, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come." When you and I accepted Christ as our savior he took all our sin away. We were clean, but we had to work at following Christ. Some things were easy and other things were more difficult. A change was made but also we had to do things differently and do different things. This is what is called CHANGE. Change doesn't always happen overnight. I can tell you that God is still changing me on a daily basis. Scripture gives us many examples of how we should act, but we must be listening and following that good instruction. In Romans 12:2 says, "Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think. Then you will know God's will for you, which is good and pleasing and perfect."

I think I may speak for many of us when I say I don't like change. I like things to stay the same, but God's word constantly reminds me that the old way I did things needs to change. 1 John 1:6 says, "So we are lying if we say we have fellowship with God but go on living in spiritual darkness; we are not practicing the truth." 1 John 1:8-9 says, "If we claim we have no sin, we are only fooling ourselves and not living in the truth. But if we confess our sins to him, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all wickedness." I am convinced that God is not done dealing with me and my sin. He wants me to change and see things in a new way.

There are many ways to get change in my life. Study God's word daily. I don't mean just reading it, or memorizing it, or repeating it, or just writing it down until you get it. Pray for help from all parts of God. i.e. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Maybe even talk to your friends about what needs to change in your life. Let them help you be accountable. I will end with this question for you. What needs to change in your life today to bring you to a closer walk with God?

It seems like we have just been through a month of a lot of winners and losers. Many are familiar with the term March Madness. Whether it's the NCAA tournament or the NIT tournament there are a whole bunch of losers with only one team coming out ultimately as the winner. The MHSAA playoffs took place with our own school Mackinaw City Comets being represented very well as both guys and gals went to regionals with the gals winning the regional championship for the first time ever. I believe they were good enough to make it to the finals, but it wasn't to be. They, like all of us, have to experience losing as well.

By the time you read this newsletter, I will have preached a sermon on the subject of this article, but I am led none the less to share a shortened version here. When making peace after a war, who is expected to give up and give in the most? The answer obviously is the loser gives up the most. The victor controls the terms!

What is interesting to me is that as we approach Easter there was an established Sovereign (winner or king) which is Jesus. There was also an established vassal (loser or enemy conquered) which is sin and as sinners we were enemies as Romans 5:10 states "when we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of His Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life."

The winner, Jesus, reconciled us like a victorious king would do when cutting a covenant with the loser. But what is amazing here is that the one who paid dearly was not the vassal (sinner – me) but the Sovereign (Jesus). He died and paid a horrible price while we paid nothing and reaped an eternal reward, the forgiveness of sins. This seems backward but what it really reveals is just how much our King loves us as he became victorious through his resurrection.

I am thrilled to be the vassal and serve the King! He paid dearly and I paid nothing, but I am eternally beholden to him and count it a privilege to serve the one who won my freedom. Christ made the loser (me) the winner! He looked like a loser on the cross, but he came back on Sunday as the winner. Ohhhhh the irony. And oh the sweet victory.

Aren't you glad he did what he did. Aren't you glad he a paid we couldn't pay! We are the recipients of the greatest gift ever given.
