I have been preparing a new class that I would like to teach in the fall. I had thought of offering a class for new believers, but God had another plan. I'm going to prepare to teach a class for those who want to take the next step in their faith. A step toward

an improved relationship with God. Paul talks about this to the Church at Corinth. 1 Corinthians 3:2 says, "I gave you milk not solid food, for you were not ready for it." Are you still drinking milk?

How long have you been drinking milk? Is it time to grow up? There came a time when I really needed God, but I still wanted to do things my way. Satan had a good hold on me. He had me where he wanted me, and I was useless for God because I was without purpose. Maybe it was my last chance, maybe it wasn't, but something told me I needed more in my life. When God Crosses Our Path
Pastor and martyr Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote, "God will be constantly crossing our paths and canceling our plans by sending us people with claims and petitions." Last spring, the

whole world had plans canceled, first by Covid-19 and then by God "sending us people with claims and petitions." Some needed prayers for healing or for coping with grief. Medical staff, teachers, pastors and others serving long hours needed support: meals, check-in calls, "thinking of you" cards. Parents working remotely while helping kids with distance-learning needed encouragement. Crucial nonprofit work still required donations.

Pre-pandemic, you may not have realized that staying home or wearing a face mask could be a ministry. Or that sending a card expresses love in Jesus' name. Or that buying takeout from a local restaurant can be a gift to the owners. When our calendars empty, God "crosses our paths" in new ways — both to be with us and to nudge us toward others (even if virtually, or 6 feet apart!).



Always Within Reach

As I grow older, I appreciate help getting up from the couch. Often, my husband extends his arm to boost me up. This act of kindness reminds me how the Lord reaches out to me each morning. He is the strength to lift me up so I

needn't depend on myself.

Looking back through the years, I can see how the Lord endlessly extended his arm to me. Isaiah 33:2 says, "O LORD, be gracious to us; we wait for you. Be our arm every morning, our salvation in the time of trouble." Too often I haven't waited for the Lord, and my impatience resulted in no-good results. Waiting for — and accepting — God's guidance isn't always easy, but he always comes through, and we're never out of his reach.

Has anyone noticed that the election season is heating up! We added a little extra flavor this time around with a pre-election pandemic and threw in some protests (rightly so) and riots (wrongly so) and then add to it restricted travel, mask wearing, economic turmoil and you have a recipe for some interesting dialogue. Folks, I am not making light of any of the above but I am concerned that we draw such hard lines on issues that we either have to agree completely with someone or we are considered the enemy.

Can we agree on some things like ice cream or popcorn (I think a large majority agree on this) Ha! Ha! I am trying to find a common denominator. I like dialoguing with people about their beliefs and passions, but it can be a dangerous venture when the tongue and the emotions aren't held in check. I witness this on Facebook more than I would like to admit.

Here is a real practical passage from James 1:26-27 to consider,

“If anyone considers himself religious and yet does not keep a tight rein on his tongue, he deceives himself and his religion is worthless. Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by this world.”

This passage in essence is saying, “put your faith into practice!” If I believe in mercy and grace, then practice it. If I believe in love, then love the unlovable. If I believe that Jesus died for my sin, then he also died for others sin as well. If I believe I am forgiven, then I need to forgive others.

At times like these I believe the Church can really shine so let's not mess up the opportunity to be light and salt to a world that has seemed to lose its direction. Let's share the truth but do so in love. One of my favorite non-biblical phrases is “a spoonful of sugar helps the medicine go down.” We have lost that art of sharing the truth with a “spoonful of sugar.” Not watering down the truth but helping those who hear it to receive it because it is shared in love.

We can be decisive without being divisive. We can be strong without being mean. We can engage instead of shutting off.
