Mike's Musings

I know from experience that sometimes life is messy. I mean things happen that make life hard and it feels like a struggle we just can't bear. Like unexpected bills, or prolonged illness, loss of a job, or relationship problems. Even sometimes death of loved ones, or the pain of things that just don't seem fair. We all have them and yet we don't always deal with them in a good way. So why do we struggle so hard with life, often times it because we don't prepare ourselves spiritually.

First, as Christian, we don't understand where our struggles come from. Paul writes Ephesians 6:12 "For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms."

Second, we must believe that God's word doesn't lie. God gave Paul these words to let us know the truth. Ephesians 6:13-17 "Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God."

Third, we have to understand we don't stand alone. God has a plan and He even uses the evil that Satan intends for bad for good. Romans 8:28, which states, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose" This verse explains that we need to love God and know He has a purpose for us.

If we put on the armor of God, trust He doesn't lie and know he is working things out no matter what it looks like, we will get through whatever is going on in our lives. It may sound too simple, but I say these things from experience. Try these three steps when you feel life is out of control and see how God works for you.

I've begun a preaching series on 1 John since the start of the new year. I don't think I have ever done a series on John's first letter. It seems that a major theme that resonates in this letter is the theme of "love." It is mentioned in some form 45 times in this small letter.

Love is such a broadly used term I wonder how well we understand it as used in Holy Scripture. Love as presented on TV is a fleeting term. It comes and goes. It is dependent on others responding in like kind. It seeks sensuality as opposed to depth and duration. It's a throwaway term if things don't work out. It's conditional! It just doesn't last.



When John was writing this letter to the believers it is clear that there was some erring in the church and splits were beginning to take place (no different than in today's church). There was a major concern with Gnosticism (one of the components was denying Jesus' humanity and invoking a kind of dualism). Another component was seeing the body as sinful and the spirit as good. There was a need to treat both body and soul independently of each other. You could do evil things and yet be spiritually pure, divorcing us from moral responsibility.

In many ways, John's letter addressed a lot of these concerns. First and foremost, Jesus was from the beginning and also lived amongst us, and intervened for us on the cross, as fully human and fully divine. How we respond to that awesome love expression is to love others as He has loved us. We can't separate how we love from how we express our love for God. Our love for God is expressed in how we live, how we behave, how we interact with his children.

Real love is not a feeling or a fleeting moment, it is based on a real relationship with Jesus that has affected my whole being. How do others know we are Christians? By our love!

It is evidenced in our actions! It is evidenced in our hearts! It is evidenced in our words! It is evidenced in how we live in our community! It can only and truly be consistently evidenced when we seek to walk in relationship with the one who died on the cross and rose again so we could have an unfettered relationship with God.

I want us to walk through 1 John together over the next couple months to really understand the love of God manifest in the church of Jesus Christ. I'm looking forward to it.
