



LGBTQ+ QUICK FACTS

Bisexuality is the capacity to form physical, romantic, and/or emotional attraction to people of more than one gender. Although traditionally this is only referred to the gender binary of male and female, it is now accepted to include cis, transgender, and nonbinary people (and all those inbetween). There is a broad spectrum of identities sometimes connected to the bi community, other identities under the bi umbrella could include pan, poly, omni, or queer, but not all people who identify as those identify with bi.

- WHAT IT IS -

The bisexual pride flag was designed by a team led by Michael Page in 1998 to give the bisexual community its own symbol comparable to the gay pride flag of the larger LGBT community. His aim was to increase the visibility of bisexuals, both among society as a whole and within the LGBT community. Page explains the meanings of the colors as "The pink color represents sexual attraction to the same sex only (gay and lesbian). The blue represents sexual attraction to the opposite sex only (straight) and the resultant overlap color purple represents sexual attraction to both sexes (bi)."
