A motion was made by Councilman Ashe and seconded by Councilman Neiland that this bid be accepted. This motion was passed by unanimous vote for the Council.

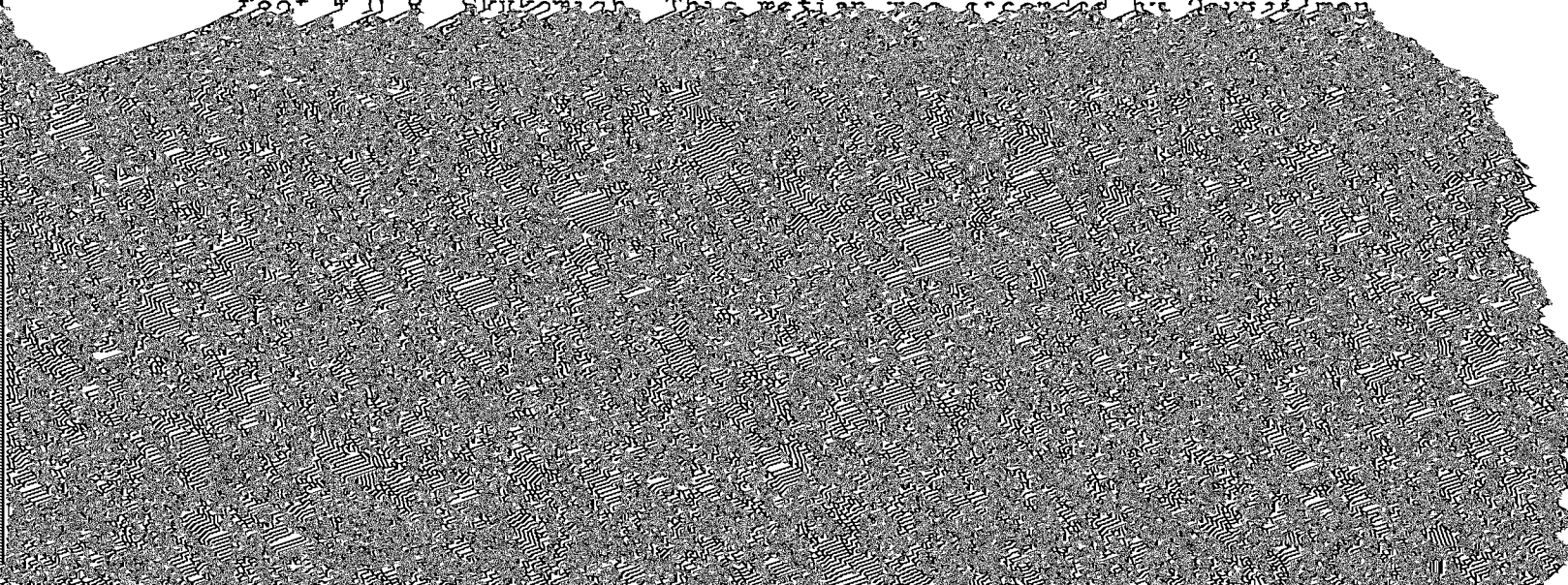

Letter from Town of Monroe thanking the Town of Skykomish for releasing C.E. Martin, well driller, to take care of an emergency repair of the Monroe Water Well.

Letter from the Health Department regarding water supply system and informing the city that a plan must be approved before the new well system is put in to operation. Mr. C. E. Miller, the well driller, stated that he will make an extra copy of the well blueprints to be submitted to the state Dept of Health.

Committee Reports:

No report from the street Department Committee.

Mr. C. E. Miller made a report on the progress of the city well. He stated that the depth of the well was now 132 ft.

A letter was read from Mr. Ourlser regarding the continuity bond for H. Riemer. They stated that this method was now legal due to a new law governing 3rd. and 4th class Towns. The clerk was instructed to make application for the continuity bond for the Treasurer.

The clerk presented a new insurance policy for the city street dump truck and snow plow. A motion was made by Councilman Pasley that this policy be renewed. This motion was seconded by Councilman Handy. The motion was carried by an unanimous vote of the Council. By permission of Councilman Pasley who made the motion and Councilman Handy who seconded the motion it was amended to include the continuity bond for the Treasurer. This amendment was passed by a unanimous vote of the council.

The final reading of ordinance No. 78 pertaining to the transfer of \$3,000.00 from the light sinking fund to the Water Fund was read. A motion was made by Councilman Handy and seconded by Councilman Pasley, that this ordinance be adopted. The motion was carried by a unanimous vote of the council. The clerk was instructed to post same according to law.

A motion was made by Councilman Thompson, and seconded by Councilman Neiland, that \$1,351.64 be paid to C.E. Miller for completion of the drilling of 100 ft. on the city well as per contract. This motion was passed by unanimous vote of the council.

A resolution was read by the clerk for budgeting \$ 2,890.76 for the city street fund, \$1,790.76 for the maintenance of streets and \$1,100.00 for construction. A motion was made by Councilman Handy and seconded by Councilman Pasley that this resolution be adopted. Motion carried by unanimous vote of the council.

A motion at this time by Councilman Thompson which was seconded by Councilman Handy that this meeting be recessed until 7:30 next tuesday evening was carried by a unanimous vote of the council. Meeting recessed.
