

Regular Meeting-January 12, 1970

This meeting was called to order by Mayor Norton.

Councilmen present: Gale, Anderson, Datema, McCausland.
Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.
Current bills were read and ordered paid.

Mayor Norton asked the nomination committee to submit their list of nominees to fill the vacant position on the council. The list included Con Everson, William Broadhead and Mickie Henry. A vote was taken by secret ballot by the four councilmen with a resulting tie vote. Mayor Norton cast a tie breaking ballot which elected William Broadhead. Mayor Norton was to contact Mr. Broadhead to see if he would accept the appointment until the next election.

Councilman Anderson advised the council that the Fire Department thru the town could purchase property from the school Dist. at a price of \$200.00 for the property and tearing down the old school bus garage.

Councilman Anderson made a motion that the town purchase the school property located next to the old school bus garage for a price of \$200.00 and that a maximum of \$500.00 be pledged toward removal of the old bus garage. The property to be used for a site for the new Fire garage which the firemen wish to build. This motion was seconded by Councilman Datema and was carried by a vote of all councilmen present.


The clerk was asked to write a letter to the Assocation of Washington cities requesting information regarding any short training schools for police officers in this vicinity.

Some discussion took place regarding the best method of snow removal and plowing of the towns streets.

A motion was made by Councilman Gales and seconded by Councilman Anderson that the town purchase some new "Dead End" street signs and also some new "No PARKING" signs. This motion was carried by a vote of all councilmen present.

Mayor Norton advised that Frank Fosterling has inquired regarding annexation of his property to the town. The council was advised that in order to annex all of the property in the area would have to come in and that several tracts between the town limits and Fosterlings property did not wish to be annexed.

Being no further business a motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Anderson and seconded by Councilman Datema that this meeting be adjourned. Motion carried.

Councilman Anderson reported that the phone company could install a fire alarm system that would ring at 10 Firemen residences home phones. The initial fee would be \$280.00 and \$30.00 per month maintenance fee. The system would also ring the siren as soon as the alarm was phoned in.

A motion was made by Councilman Anderson and seconded by Councilman McCausland that the Town have the phone co. install a phone alarm system. The motion was passed by a vote of all councilmen present. It was suggested that the town inquire if a system of five phones could not be installed instead of ten.

The matter of police protection was brought up by Mayor Norton. He advised that Joselyn would like to quit as marshall. Jim Vorderbueggen was present and applied for the job as marshall. Mayor Norton advised he would like the applicant to take some training and that he would try and contact Monroe Police Dept. regarding a training program.

The clerk was instructed to again write Hays Evans, Supt. of Sanitation for King County advising that the Town would have to close the garbage pit to the outside public if the county did not up its rental fee to \$75.00 per month.

A motion was made by Councilman McCausland and seconded by Councilman Roy Gale that the Hotel Inspection of the License Dept. lock into the matter of roomers staying at the Skykomish Hotel.

A motion was made by Councilman Anderson and seconded by Councilman McCausland that the Marshall salary be increased to \$76.00 to start. Motion carried by a vote of all councilmen present.

Mayor Norton appointed newly appointed councilman Broadhead to the Water committee and the Street committee.

Being no further business a motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Broadhead and seconded by Councilman McCausland. Motion carried.

Current bills were read and approved by the finance committee.

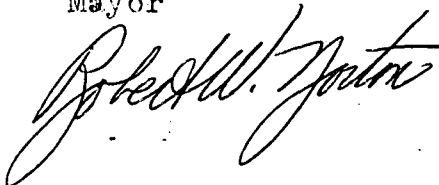
Mayor Norton advised the council that something would have to be done to better control use of the garbage dump and suggested that perhaps the dump should be closed to private persons except between the hours of 10:00 A.M. and 2 P.M. on Saturdays and Sundays. He also suggested that a sign be posted prohibiting the dumping of car bodies and other bulky items. The council agreed with the mayor and also suggested that the Sanitation Department of the King County Department of Public Works be informed of these new regulations.

A motion was made by Councilman ~~Anderson~~ McCausland, and seconded by Councilman Anderson that the town adopt a resolution to impose a $\frac{1}{2}$ % sales tax effective April 1st, under authority granted pursuant to chapter 94, Laws of 1970, First Extraordinary Session of the Washington State Legislature, and authorizing the Mayor and the clerk to enter into a contract with the State Department of Revenue to collect said sales tax for the town. This motion was passed by a unanimous vote of the Council.

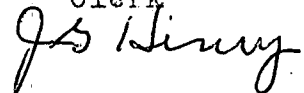

This meeting was called to order by Mayor Norton,

Minutes of the previous meeting read and approved.
Current bills were read and ordered paid.

Mayor Norton advised the council that the King County Sanitation department did a good job in rebuilding the garbage dump and would provide a front end loader cat to maintain the dump. Councilman McCausland advised that he thought the State Highway Department would pay \$50.00 a year for the use of the dump for their hiway litter barrels. The clerk was instructed to write to the highway department regarding their use of the dump.

A motion was made by Councilman Anderson and seconded by councilman Datema that the town charge the State Highway Department and the Stevens Pas Company \$50.00 per year for the use of the dump. This motion was carried by a vote of all councilmen present.

Con Everson reported for the Fire Department regarding construction of a metal building for the Fire department. He advised that Western Farmers co-op of Monroe would construct a metal building 40x40 for \$3,764.80. This would be without a floor nor would it be wired. Mayor Norton suggested that the council look at the buildings at the Mone mine near Money creek as these are the same type buildings.

A motion was made by Councilman Anderson and seconded by Councilman McCausland that Joyce Hanson be hired as police matron and grounds keeper for the city hall grounds. Motion carried by unanimous vote of the council.


A motion was made by Councilman McCausland and seconded by Councilman Datema that Water Collector Maloney be authorized to purchase 3000 5¢ cards and have them printed for water statements. Motion carried by unanimous vote of the council.

A motion by Anderson and seconded by Datema that the Forward Thrust bank money of \$3602.00 be placed in a savings account was carried.

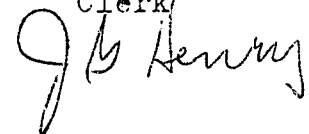

Specila Meeting, May 22, 1970

This special meeting was called by Mayor, ~~Anderson~~^{Norton}, for the purpose of discussing the following. No.1 Forest Service Garbage Collection, No 2. Financing of a new fire hall, No 3. Purchase of a new riding mower for the ball park.

Councilmen present: McCausland, Datema, Anderson.

Item No.1- Councilman Anderson reported that a total of 2923 cans of garbage per year was dumped by the Forest Service or an average of 60 cans a week over a 12 months period. He suggested that at 10¢ per can that this would amount to around \$300.00 per year. Councilman McCausland made a motion that the town accept the Forest Service garbage at the rate of \$25.00 per month on a trial basis. This motion was seconded by Councilman Anderson and passed by a vote of all councilmen present.

Item #2, Fire Hall tabled until a later date.

Item #3. Mower for Ball Park. A motion was made by Councilman Anderson and seconded by Councilman Datema that the town purchase a riding power mower of no less that 8 horse power with floating head and that not over \$500.00 be spent for the mower. This motion carried by a vote of all councilmen present. Minutes were kept by Councilman McCausland in absense of Clerk Henry Meeting adjourned.

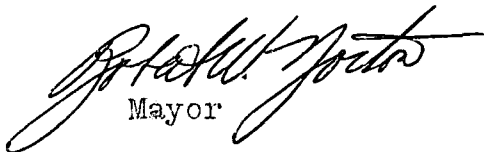
The clerk was instructed to obtain information pertaining to part time payed fire department personell and whether or not they would come under the firemens pension law.

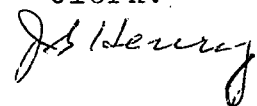
Mayor Norton requested Marshall Vorderbrueggen to see if he could slow down the speeders on the town streets.

Current bill were read and ordered paid.

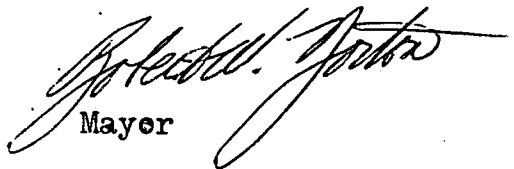

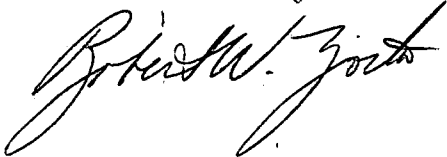

Current bills were read and approved for payment.

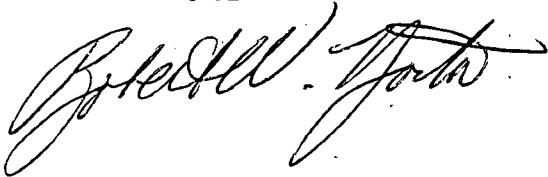

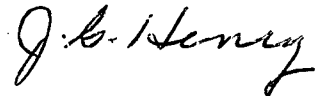
Mayor Norton advised the council that the new pipe line on 1st Street would be completed by the end of the week.

Water Collector Maloney turned in a list of delinquent water accounts to the water committee.

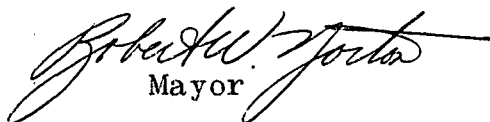
Mayor Norton advised the council that in the future building permits will not be issued until application for a building permit is reviewed and approved by the council.

Councilmen present: Anderson, Datema, Gale, McCausland.

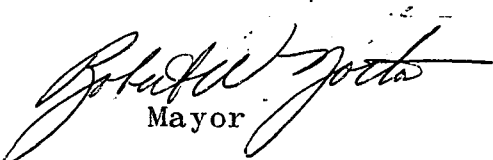

Mr. Don Flynn was present to ask the Council their opinion on submission of a bid for the metal building offered for sale by the U.S. Forest Service. Mr. Flynn said the building could be used for the new firehouse. General discussion by the Councilmen was negative to the idea. The Council felt it was better to build a new building to house the town fire trucks.

Marshall Vorderbrueggen advised Mayor Norton that his assistant would probably be available over Tunnel Day weekend.

Mr. Barney Bertrand was present to express his concern for the problems with the City Garbage Dump. Mr. Bertrand thought the city should have an attendant at the dump during the weekends and that a charge should be enforced for county users of the dump. Discussed water situation on house in Milltown. Decided to let frozen pipe thaw by itself.

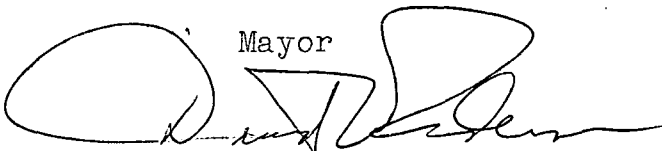

Attending the meeting was Wes Zeman, Burlington Northern and Graig Baker from the Dept. of Ecology.

Mr. Zeman explained the proposal the Railroad has to construct a 125' ditch along the dike between 5th and 6th Street. The speculated depth of the ditch would be 10-12' x 2'. The proposed interceptor ditch would be covered the entire length.

Mr. Zeman feels that the oil came from old oil at the Railroad yard in the early 1900's. He feels the railroad ditch would pick up about 5 or 10 gallons a week.

The Railroad is recommending the removal of their diesel fueling facility from Skykomish.

The Dept. of Ecology figures the oil seeps into the River for a 300 to 400 yard area. Graig Baker stated the standards for water quality in this State and the oil in the River exceeds these standards.

Dennis McCausland brought up the concern over snow removal on the Street with the ditch being there.

Roy Gale suggested waiting until next summer to see ^{IF} the oil quantity increases or drops off.

The Corps of Engineers will be contacted to see if a ditch will damage the Dike.

Mayor Anderson suggested a shorter ditch (25') to see if that would do the job.

The meeting adjourned at 9 P.M. with the Railroad going to meet with the Corps of Engineers to decide if a ditch would damage the Dike.

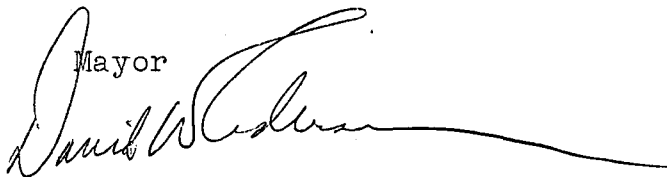

(See Maps concerning letter). Test holes would be 16" in diameter and about 9' deep. B.N. feels this construction will work in diverting the oil from the River into the test tubes. At this time there are no alternatives if this project does not work. Oil will be pumped periodically from the test holes. B.N. will maintain. B.N.'s proposal has been approved by the Dept. of Ecology (Flood Control Dept.) as a deterrent for the oil reaching the River. Flood Control Dept. of Ecology suggested the above method of controlling black oil flow in the Skykomish River.

B.N. has made concentrated efforts in disposing of the oil problem in the area where it originates. In filling their oil tanks, they had the approval of the Dept. of Ecology that their attempts were justified and that no oil was there at the time of fill in.

An agreement will be drawn up between the Town of Sky and B.N. in connection with Liability and Responsibility concerning the Street and any other liabilities involved. B.N. & Dept. of Ecology feels that construction will begin in about 4 months, purely because of bureaucracy. Shoreline Management also concerned.

B.N. will draft proposal in regards to test holes and have fair estimate of costs. Their proposal will hopefully meet Shoreline Management Act. Would like to know also whether they will need a Shoreline permit in conjunction with County?

A public hearing will be held whenever the Shoreline Permit is applied for.

Councilman McCausland made a motion to accept B.N.'s proposed plans as shown on map, in relation that B.N. take responsibilities in regards to Street and other Liabilities. Councilman Key seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Marshall Walls & Snider have been using the Police car for transportation to E.M.T. training at Duvall twice a week, so that is the reason the gas bill is higher than usual.

Electricity bill higher than normal because of heater used in keeping Pump house dry at Reservoir.

Councilman Henry said he would ask Lanny Walls if he would act as Deputy while Ed Loomer is gone.

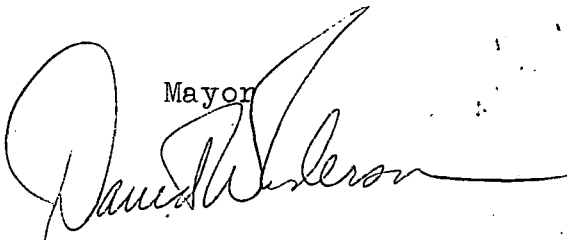

Read letter on Shoreline Management Act. Master program was due June 20th. Will call Martha and set a date for a meeting.

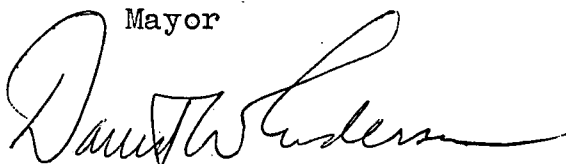
Discussed overdue water bills. Clerk was instructed to send cut-off notices.

Discussed the need for more tools at the City shop, due to the recent break-in. Councilman Gale will price the necessary items and report at next meeting.

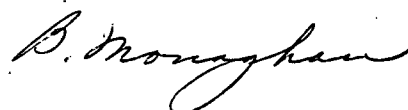

Discussed purchase of new tools. Agnew Hardware of Everett gave a wholesale price of \$462.20. Councilman Hornsby was appointed to check prices with another supplier. Will report at next meeting.

Marshal Loomer reported that he now has a radio for Police car. Snohomish County also furnished antenna to their frequency. It will be used in emergency only until he hears from the W.S.P. Marshal Loomer would like 2 police phones installed. One for his home and one for helper. Marshal Loomer was asked to check on cost, etc. Will report at next meeting.
