Special meeting-August 30th, 1965

This meeting was call by Mayor Freestad for the purpose of reviewing the proposed pipe line extension from the city pump house to the site of the new administration building of the United State Forest Service which is being constructed on U.S. Highway #2 east of Skykomish.

Mayor Freestad advised the council that the Pacific Waterworks co. had a surpluss of transite pipe in Canada which could be purchased at this time at a reduction of 5¢ per foot.

District Ranger Dale Farley was present and explained that the proposed construction plan of the Forest Service included the Administration building which is under construction and the future construction of 5 homes and a public park. He also stated that the Forest Service would issue a purchase order to the town to cover the cost of installation and hook-up of the pipeline as soon as bids were awarded and that payment could be expected in about 20 days after completion of the project.

A motion was made by Councilman Snell and was seconded by Councilman Thompson that the town issue a call for bids for the installation of approximately 3300 feet of 6" asbestos-cement transite pipe to be laid 30" deep and covered with suitable material, also for encasement pipe to be pushed under the State Highway and the Great Northern Tracks together with necessary valves and tees and that the contractor be required to post a 100% performance bond, adequate liability insurance, & industrial insurance and that there shall be a time limit of four weeks to complete the project. This motion was carried by a vote of all members of the council. It was also suggested that the town obtain all necessary permits and easements necessary for the project.

Being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Richards and seconded by Councilman Snell.

A letter from the State Board for Volunteer Fireman was read by the clerk. The letter stated that the annual fee for insurance for volunteer firemen had this year been increased from \$3.50 to \$5.00 per member and that this fee must be paid by March 1st. 1966.

Councilman Stanton advised the council that she had received a complaint that the Skykomish Hotel, dba Sweet Pea's Inc., was renting rooms or sleeping space to guests. That to her knowledge there were no lights, heat or sanitation and that if this were true then a fire hazard existed which created a great danger to persons and property. After some discussion by members of the council present it was suggested that the clerk write to the Department of Labor and Industries suggesting that this operation be inspected.

Mayor Freestad reported to the council regarding snow removal costs, equipment breakdown and other matters pertaining to the recent snow. He also reported that the Great Northern had helped the town in snow removal and suggested that the clerk write a letter of thanks to Mr. Henry Ferryman, Maintenance Supervisor for the railroad Company.

A motion was made by Councilman Richards and seconded by Councilman Thompson that the Treasurer be authorized to transfer \$831.60 Utility Tax from the Water Department to the Current Expense fund to cover the Water Utility Tax for the year 1965, and that the Current Expense fund repay \$300.00 owing to the Water Department. This motion was passed by an affirmative vote of all councilmen present.




