A motion was made by Councilman Stanton and seconded by Councilman Handy that Supt Gregor be given a six month leave and at the expiration of that time if the job of Water Supt. & Marshall for the Town shall not have been satisfactorily filled then Mr. Gregor shall be considered for re-einstatement to his former position. This motion was carried by the affirmative vote of Councilmen Stanton, Pasley, and Handy. Councilmen Neiland and Thompson did not vote on the motion.

Mayor Bishop advised the Council that the city water pump had been turned on at the request of the Bloedel Donovan Lumber Co., and that the costs of operation would be billed to that Company.

An ordinance was introduced to the Council by Mayor Bishop whereby the Town of Skykomish would create a cumulative reserve fund for the town water system and fire protection, and that the town Treasurer shall deposit in said fund all sums of money now or hereafter budgeted or appropriated for the purpose of said fund.

A motion was made by Councilman Handy and seconded by Councilman Thompson that the ordinance creating a cumulative reserve fund for the water system and fire protection be adopted. This motion was passed by a vote of all councilmen present. The clerk was ordered to post copies of the proposed ordinance according to law and to inform the public that a protest hearing on said budget will be held at the Town Hall on October 4, 1943.

A motion was made by councilman Handy and seconded by Councilman Pasley that \$2,000.00 be transferred from the Current Expense fund to the water fund. This motion was carried by a vote of all councilmen present.

Mr. Fournier requested through Councilman Neiland that the town build a concrete sidewalk from the main street to connect with the church walk. He agreed to furnish the cement. No action was taken by the council regarding this walk.

The finance committee presented the council with a proposed budget of receipts and expenditures for the Town of Skykomish for the fiscal year 1944. A motion was made by Councilman Thompson and seconded by Council Handy that this proposed budget be accepted. Motion carried. The clerk was instructed to post copies of the proposed budget according to law and advise of a protest hearing to be held at the Town Hall at 7:30 on October 4th, 1943.
