First and second reading of said ordinance was read by the clerk, and the ordinance was published according to law. This ordinance shall be retroactive to January 1st. 1945.

The subject of doing a new surface job on the city streets was discussed at this meeting. Ed. Phunderburg was present at the meeting and explained how he would process the streets and get them ready for oiling. A price of .35¢ per sq. yard for oiling and graveling was made by Rush and Baird. Mr. Phunderburg made a price of \$1,650.00 to process all of the city streets with the exception of the main street from the Skykomish Hotel to past the Cascadia Hotel.

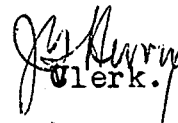

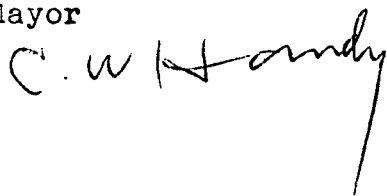
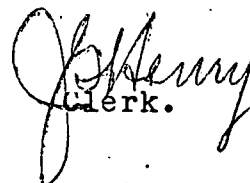
