Councilman Neiland made a report on the U.S. Forest Service water rates. He suggested that the clerk write to the Forestry Department and advise them that due to increased cost of maintenance on the water department that it will be necessary to increase their water rate to \$10.00 per quarter.

The Clerk was instructed to write to Mr. McRenalds of the Forest Service regarding the purchase of several lengths of culvert pipe which they have on hand at their Skykomish Station.
