Communications read by the clerk included a letter from the County Assessor and from the Department of Public Service.

Mayor Bishop advised the council that a representative from the Dept. of Public Service was in town regarding the Trailway Bus schedule.

A motion was made by Councilman Pasley and seconded by Councilman Isackson that the town council go on record as opposing the temporary discontinuance of the bus service to Skykomish. This motion was carried by a vote of all councilmen present.

The second and third reading of proposed ordinance No. 105 being an ordinance regulating and licensing of amusement devices was read by the clerk. As there were no protest to the passage of this ordinance a motion was made by Councilman Anderson and seconded by Councilman Isackson that this ordinance be adopted. This motion was passed by a unanimous vote of the council.

The second and third reading of proposed ordinance No. 106, being an ordinance calling for an excess levy of .15 mills and causing such proposition to be placed on the ballot at the town election on March 8, was read by the clerk. Being no protests to the passage of this ordinance a motion was made by Councilman Isackson and seconded by Councilman Roberts that this ordinance be adopted. This motion was passed by a vote of all councilmen present.

A motion was made by Councilman Thompson and seconded by Councilman Anderson that the council investigate the feasibility of putting an electric heater in the jail to replace the wood stove. This motion was passed by a unanimous vote of the council.

A resolution was introduced creating an emergency and appropriating money from any funds available to pay the town's share of matching money for the construction of a rock revetment on the Skykomish River within the limits of the town. A motion was made by Councilman Thompson and seconded by Councilman Isackson that this resolution be adopted. This motion was passed by a unanimous vote of the council.

A resolution was introduced authorizing the Town Treasurer to transfer \$1,500.00 from the Water Department to the current Expense fund and authorizing the clerk to draw a warrant from the Current Expense fund in the amount of \$2,500.00 payable to the Treasurer of the United States as the town's share of the cost in the construction of a new rock revetment. A motion was made by Councilman Roberts and seconded by Councilman Anderson that this resolution be adopted. This motion was passed by a vote of all councilmen present.

A resolution was introduced that would assume the obligation of maintaining the rock revetment etc as required by the U.S. Army Engineers. Motion by Councilman Pasley and seconded by Councilman Thompson that this resolution be adopted. Motion carried by a vote of all councilmen present.

Being no further business a motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Anderson and seconded by Councilman Thompson. Motion carried.

Councilman Issackson informed the council that the Parent Teachers Association would furnish \$30.00 for material for the construction of new bookcases in the library.

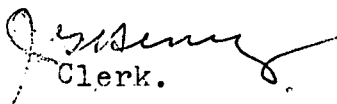
