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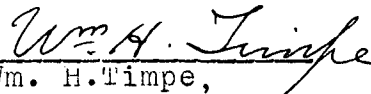

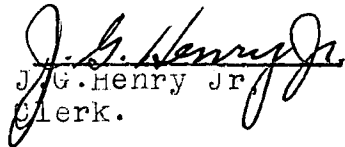

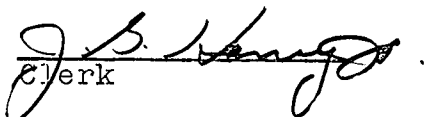
The clerk was instructed to post notices warning that dogs about the streets are becoming a public nuisance and unless taken care of they will be disposed of.

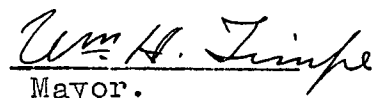
Mr. Siver, a representative of the Meshner Supply Co. was a visitor at this meeting. He quoted some prices on copper and other small dimension pipes.

R.P. Walters was a visitor at this meeting and inquired of the Council if they would abandon ~~Second~~<sup>First</sup> Street of the Town of Skykomish. This street has not been used for many years and Mr. Walters requested that the street be vacated and the property deeded to each adjoining property owner.

A Motion was made by Councilmen Donoho and seconded by Councilman Bishop that the Town of Skykomish pay Maranda's Garage for the G.M.C. Truck shaft that was sent on a duplicated order. This motion carried by a vote of all councilmen present.

Mr. Sipe, a resident of this town, filed a complaint with the clerk regarding sewers emptying into the Skykomish River. He pointed out the very unsanitary condition that this practice was causing. The Clerk was instructed to contact the County Health Department for any present laws governing such disposal of sewers, garbage etc.

Mr. Edward Neiland, town Councilman elect, was a visitor at this meeting. He made a request of the Council to have a street light placed at the end of the street west from his residence. A request was also made for a street light on second street South.

May 3rd meeting continued.

A resolution setting up a City Street Fund and making the transfere of certain budgetary items to such a fund and further to close out the present Highway Fund was presented by the clerk.

The council authorized the Water Supt. to construct a 3/4" pipe line to King and Kenneys house.

Marshall Gregor was authorized to purchase blankets for the City Jail.

An ordiance was introduced by Councilman Pasley, vacating First Street of the Town of Skykomish from Railroad Avenue North to the Skykomish River according to the official plat of the Town of Skykomish now on file and of record in the office of the Auditor of King County Washington. This proposed ordinance was accepted by the council by a Motion by Councilman Handy and seconded by Councilman Donoho. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

This proposed ordinance, No. 72, was read twice by the clerk and will be published in the Monroe Monitor. The final radding to be made on June 7th, 1937.

The clerk road a letter from the State Liquor Board asking that the Town install an ordinance licensing dancing and music in Beer Parlors or prohibiting it intirely. The clerk was instructed to write the Board that this would be taken care of.

Mr. Willet, a resident of this town made a request to the council to have a water line run to his house which is now being built ~~near~~ the highway at the east end of town. The council requested the water committee to investigate and determine the cost of constructing such a line.

Mr. Hess and Mr. Kruse, of The Puget Sound Power and Light Co., were visitors at this meeting. They explained to the council the new system of light rates for street lights which is to be effective soon. It was pointed out that the town could now install one or two new street lights and still make a savings over the period of a year.

Councilmen elect, Edward Neiland, and Carrol Handy, and Treasurer elect, Harvey Riemer, were sworn into their respective offices at this meeting.

A petition was read by the clerk asking that the speed limit law be enforced in the Town of Skykomish. This petition was signed by 13 wemon residents. The clerk was instructed to order two warning speed limit signs for the highway.

A report was made that the walk in front of McEvoy's building is in a unsafe condition and should be condemned. The clerk was instructed to contact the property owner and inform him that a new walk must be put in.

Some discussion was made regarding the repair of the highway bridge near the Skykomish Motors Garage.

A motion was made by councilman Pasley that one or two men be hired to help the street supt. get the streets in shape for oiling and when the weather conditions permit that the clerk place an order for oil. This motion was seconded by Councilman Bishop and was carried by a vote of all councilmen present.

The third and final reading of ordinance No. 72 intitlled " An Ordinance vacating First Street of the Town of Skykomish from Railroad Avenue, North to the Skykomish River" was made at this meeting. A motion was made by councilman Donoho and seconded by Councilman Bishop, that ordinance No 72 be adopted. This motion was carried by a unanimous vote of the council. The clerk was instructed to file said ordinance.

Mr. Chitty of the Puget Sound Power and Light Company was a visitor at this meeting. He inquired concerning the pumping station project which the city talked off installing. The Council informed Mr. Chitty that the pumping project was not progressed to the point where they could give him much data regarding power needed. Mr. Chitty said that he would furnish the council with figures on maintenance for a 40 H.P. motor for periods of three and four months operation.

Mr. Eshe requested the town to pipe water to his property which is located along the East Highway. The council directed the Water Supt. to install a water pipe to Mr. Eshe's property line. Councilman suggested that the water committee investigate the best location for laying a pipe line to Eshe's property. The council agreed with Councilman Bishop's suggestion.

Representatives of the Pyrene Mfg. Co. gave a demonstration of a new fire Extinguisher. They made a trade in price of 7.50 for the town's soda fire extinguisher on a new extinguisher which costs 52.50. Councilman Pasley seconded a motion which was made by Councilman Donohue that the city purchase a 15 pound size extinguisher and also keep their present one. This motion was carried by a vote of all councilmen present.

Mr. Edward Maloney, Mr. McDougall and Mr. R. Maloney were present at this meeting to request that the council increase the license fee on peddlers and hawkers.
