Councilman Pasley gave a report of the findings of the committee appointed to determine whether or not the city could hire another man to help with the street work etc. He reported that the committee did not deem it advisable to create an extra job at this time. Councilmen Neiland, Handy, and Donoho were of the same opinion. Councilman Bishop was of the opinion that the city could hire an extra man and still save money. He pointed out that having another man on steady employment that the city would not have to hire so many extra crews to catch up with their work and also that the new man could take over the highway maintenance which would be a savings of approximately 300.00 dollars a year. He also suggested installing a garbage collection system which would net the town around 200.00 per year. After due discussion a motion was made by Councilman Neiland that Water Supt. Gregor be put on a 5½ day, 8 hours a day weekly basis, except during an emergency, at which time any overtime worked will be taken off at a later date. This new hour schedule to become effective Monday April 4th, 1938. This motion was seconded by Councilman Pasley. The motion was carried by a vote of Councilmen Handy, Pasley, Donoho, Neiland. Desenting vote by Councilman Bishop.

A suggestion was made that Street Supt Gregor have District Ranger Pieper go up to the decomposed granite site near Proffits with him and look over possibilities of hauling granite out for the streets.

A motion was made by Councilman Donoho that Water Supt Gregor install a pipe line to Mr. Eshes property and Clarence Hankins's. Mr. Roney of the Eureka Hose Co. was a visitor to this meeting. H showed samples of Eureka fire hose and other fire fighting equipment.
