Father Michael's Musings



It is now March, and at St Patrick's, it means we will celebrate the feast of our patron saint, St. Patrick. We won't be alone in celebrating. In cities across the country, and even across the world, people become Irish for the day and wear their green clothing and brandish shamrocks and shillelaghs. A few will even drink more green beer than is good for any one person.

It is important to celebrate St. Patrick, but there is more to enjoy than the sentimental and fond memories and myths of the Emerald Isle. St Patrick is an excellent model of Christian faith and charity. In our year dedicated to gentle Evangelism, St Patrick is an apt patron. As a young boy, St. Patrick was captured by marauding pirates from his home on the coast of England and sold into slavery in Ireland. He labored there as a slave for more than a decade.

He finally escaped home to England, where he dedicated his life to the Church and the priesthood in thanksgiving for his deliverance. However, God had a plan for St. Patrick, and, as He always does, He turned the sacrifices St Patrick made as a slave into the foundation of a unique and powerful ministry. As he prayed for his vocation, God revealed to St. Patrick that he was to bring the Gospel back to the people who had enslaved him, so that he could preach the Word that would deliver those same people from slavery to sin and death.

St Patrick obeyed God and dedicated himself to the mission that brought the faith not only to Ireland, but through faithful Irish people to the whole world. We hope you will join us in celebrating this great saint by sharing a traditional Irish feast of corned beef and cabbage on Saturday, March 14th, at 6 PM. We look forward to seeing you.
