


Father Michael's Musings

October 2025

I was in Pennsylvania recently to visit one of our parishes. As I was checking in to fly home, the gate agent, seeing that I was in my collar and clerical shirt, burst into tears as I approached, and begged me to tell her that her beloved little dog was in heaven and that she would be with him when she got there herself. I receive this question often, and the answer should be quite simple and consistent among clergy from all jurisdictions. However, we clergy often get into theological discussions about the nature of souls and whether animals share souls, when what we should really recognize is that while there is a differ-



ence in the presence of a soul, there is a common sharing of love between us and our pets. Since God is love, and love can never be destroyed, we can safely say that, in some manner, the love we share will be preserved, and our pets will be with us in heaven.

In Genesis, as God creates the Garden and the animals and plants that populate it, He proclaims it to be "good". As He creates man, He breathes His very life into us, making us in His image, and different than the rest of Creation. And it is undeniably true that we have an animating soul, in the image of God, that makes us different from the rest of His creation. But God then gives us dominion over His creatures. We define dominion in our culture and political climate as domination, but the true sense of the word, as intended by God, is protection. He gives us the job of protecting animals. He even asks us to name the animals. In Scripture, the changing or giving of a Name binds us to God and gives us a special purpose. In allowing us to name His creatures, God allows us to share in that love that is the foundation of naming and binding. In the 8th Chapter of St. Paul's letter to the Romans, we are reminded that all creation groans for our salvation, knowing that not only we, but all of the creatures that God has made will be restored in love and purpose in the Kingdom that is to come, and in which we will live forever.

Perhaps no saint epitomized the special bond between God, man and the creatures He asked us to protect than St Francis of Assisi. He is often portrayed with birds in his hands and surrounded by deer and other woodland animals. It has become the practice of the church to bless animals on His feast day, which is October 4th, which is a Saturday this year. We will be doing a blessing of the animals at 9:00 AM this October 4th in our Memorial Garden and will have our Fall Spaghetti dinner later that day at 6:00 PM. We invite you to show your love for your pets by bringing them to the service and asking God's blessing upon them for the love and comfort they give us today, and which we will share with them forever.

This fall, our focus will be on the **Book of Genesis**, the foundational book of the Bible, exploring God's creation, promises, and the stories of faith that still shape us today.



Bring your current project or just come to enjoy the company. It's a wonderful time to connect, share ideas, and encourage one another.






