## Advent 1 12/01/2025

### **Old Testament: Isaiah 28:14-22**

<sup>14</sup> Wherefore hear the word of the LORD, ye scornful men, that rule this people which is in Jerusalem.

<sup>15</sup> Because ye have said, We have made a covenant with death, and with hell are we at agreement; when the overflowing scourge shall pass through, it shall not come unto us: for we have made lies our refuge, and under falsehood have we hid ourselves:

<sup>16</sup> Therefore thus saith the Lord God, Behold, I lay in Zion for a foundation a stone, a tried stone, a precious corner stone, a sure foundation: he that believeth shall not make haste.

<sup>17</sup> Judgment also will I lay to the line, and righteousness to the plummet: and the hail shall sweep away the refuge of lies, and the waters shall overflow the hiding place.

<sup>18</sup> And your covenant with death shall be disannulled, and your agreement with hell shall not stand; when the overflowing scourge shall pass through, then ye shall be trodden down by it.

<sup>19</sup> From the time that it goeth forth it shall take you: for morning by morning shall it pass over, by day and by night: and it shall be a vexation only to understand the report.

<sup>20</sup> For the bed is shorter than that a man can stretch himself on it: and the covering narrower than that he can wrap himself in it.

<sup>21</sup> For the LORD shall rise up as in mount Perazim, he shall be wroth as in the valley of Gibeon, that he may do his work, his strange work; and bring to pass his act, his strange act.

<sup>22</sup> Now therefore be ye not mockers, lest your bands be made strong: for I have heard from the Lord God of hosts a consumption, even determined upon the whole earth.

## **Psalm: 46 (397)**

1 GOD is our hope and strength, \* a very present help in trouble.  
2 Therefore will we not fear, though the earth be moved, \* and though the hills be carried into the midst of the sea;  
3 Though the waters thereof rage and swell, \* and though the mountains shake at the tempest of the same.  
4 There is a river, the streams whereof make glad the city of God; \* the holy place of the tabernacle of the Most Highest.  
5 God is in the midst of her, therefore shall she not be removed; \* God shall help her, and that right early.  
6 The nations make much ado, and the kingdoms are moved; \* but God hath showed his voice, and the earth shall melt away.  
7 The LORD of hosts is with us; \* the God of Jacob is our refuge.  
8 O come hither, and behold the works of the LORD, \* what destruction he hath brought upon the earth.  
9 He maketh wars to cease in all the world; \* he breaketh the bow, and knappeth the spear in sunder, and burneth the chariots in the fire.  
10 Be still then, and know that I am God: \* I will be exalted among the nations, and I will be exalted in the earth.  
11 The LORD of hosts is with us; \* the God of Jacob is our refuge.

## **Epistle: Romans 13:8-14**

<sup>8</sup> Owe no man any thing, but to love one another: for he that loveth another hath fulfilled the law.  
<sup>9</sup> For this, Thou shalt not commit adultery, Thou shalt not kill, Thou shalt not steal, Thou shalt not bear false witness, Thou shalt not covet; and if there be any other commandment, it is briefly comprehended in this saying, namely, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.  
<sup>10</sup> Love worketh no ill to his neighbour: therefore love is the fulfilling of the law.  
<sup>11</sup> And that, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep: for now is our salvation nearer than when we believed.  
<sup>12</sup> The night is far spent, the day is at hand: let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armour of light.  
<sup>13</sup> Let us walk honestly, as in the day; not in rioting and drunkenness, not in chambering and wantonness, not in strife and envying.  
<sup>14</sup> But put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make not provision for the flesh, to fulfil the lusts thereof.

**Advent 2 12/07/2025**

**Old Testament: Isaiah 55**

55 Ho, every one that thirsteth, come ye to the waters, and he that hath no money; come ye, buy, and eat; yea, come, buy wine and milk without money and without price.

<sup>2</sup> Wherefore do ye spend money for that which is not bread? and your labour for that which satisfieth not? hearken diligently unto me, and eat ye that which is good, and let your soul delight itself in fatness.

<sup>3</sup> Incline your ear, and come unto me: hear, and your soul shall live; and I will make an everlasting covenant with you, even the sure mercies of David.

<sup>4</sup> Behold, I have given him for a witness to the people, a leader and commander to the people.

<sup>5</sup> Behold, thou shalt call a nation that thou knowest not, and nations that knew not thee shall run unto thee because of the LORD thy God, and for the Holy One of Israel; for he hath glorified thee.

<sup>6</sup> Seek ye the LORD while he may be found, call ye upon him while he is near:

<sup>7</sup> Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts: and let him return unto the LORD, and he will have mercy upon him; and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon.

<sup>8</sup> For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, saith the LORD.

<sup>9</sup> For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts.

<sup>10</sup> For as the rain cometh down, and the snow from heaven, and returneth not thither, but watereth the earth, and maketh it bring forth and bud, that it may give seed to the sower, and bread to the eater:

<sup>11</sup> So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it.

<sup>12</sup> For ye shall go out with joy, and be led forth with peace: the mountains and the hills shall break forth before you into singing, and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands.

<sup>13</sup> Instead of the thorn shall come up the fir tree, and instead of the brier shall come up the myrtle tree: and it shall be to the LORD for a name, for an everlasting sign that shall not be cut off.

**Psalm: 119 vs 1-15 (489)**

BLESSED are those that are undefiled in the way, and walk in the law of the LORD.

2 Blessed are they that keep his testimonies, \* and seek him with their whole heart;

3 Even they who do no wickedness, \* and walk in his ways.

4 Thou hast charged \* that we shall diligently keep thy commandments.  
5 O that my ways were made so direct, \* that I might keep thy statutes!  
6 So shall I not be confounded, \* while I have respect unto all thy commandments.  
7 I will thank thee with an unfeigned heart, \* when I shall have learned the judgments of thy righteousness.  
8 I will keep thy statutes; \* O forsake me not utterly.  
9 WHEREWITHAL shall a young man cleanse his way? \* even by ruling himself after thy word.  
10 With my whole heart have I sought thee; \* O let me not go wrong out of thy commandments.  
11 Thy word have I hid within my heart, \* that I should not sin against thee.  
12 Blessed art thou, O LORD; \* O teach me thy statutes.  
13 With my lips have I been telling \* of all the judgments of thy mouth.  
14 I have had as great delight in the way of thy testimonies, \* as in all manner of riches.  
15 I will talk of thy commandments, \* and have respect unto thy ways.  
My delight shall be in thy statutes, \* and I will not forget thy word.

### **Epistle: Romans 15:4-13**

<sup>4</sup> For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope.  
<sup>5</sup> Now the God of patience and consolation grant you to be likeminded one toward another according to Christ Jesus:  
<sup>6</sup> That ye may with one mind and one mouth glorify God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.  
<sup>7</sup> Wherefore receive ye one another, as Christ also received us to the glory of God.  
<sup>8</sup> Now I say that Jesus Christ was a minister of the circumcision for the truth of God, to confirm the promises made unto the fathers:  
<sup>9</sup> And that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy; as it is written, For this cause I will confess to thee among the Gentiles, and sing unto thy name.  
<sup>10</sup> And again he saith, Rejoice, ye Gentiles, with his people.  
<sup>11</sup> And again, Praise the Lord, all ye Gentiles; and laud him, all ye people.  
<sup>12</sup> And again, Esaias saith, There shall be a root of Jesse, and he that shall rise to reign over the Gentiles; in him shall the Gentiles trust.

<sup>13</sup> Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that ye may abound in hope, through the power of the Holy Ghost.

### **Advent 3 12/14/2025**

#### **Old Testament: Isaiah 35:1-10**

**35** The wilderness and the solitary place shall be glad for them; and the desert shall rejoice, and blossom as the rose.

**2** It shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice even with joy and singing: the glory of Lebanon shall be given unto it, the excellency of Carmel and Sharon, they shall see the glory of the LORD, and the excellency of our God.

**3** Strengthen ye the weak hands, and confirm the feeble knees.

**4** Say to them that are of a fearful heart, Be strong, fear not: behold, your God will come with vengeance, even God with a recompence; he will come and save you.

**5** Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf shall be unstopped.

**6** Then shall the lame man leap as an hart, and the tongue of the dumb sing: for in the wilderness shall waters break out, and streams in the desert.

**7** And the parched ground shall become a pool, and the thirsty land springs of water: in the habitation of dragons, where each lay, shall be grass with reeds and rushes.

**8** And an highway shall be there, and a way, and it shall be called The way of holiness; the unclean shall not pass over it; but it shall be for those: the wayfaring men, though fools, shall not err therein.

**9** No lion shall be there, nor any ravenous beast shall go up thereon, it shall not be found there; but the redeemed shall walk there:

**10** And the ransomed of the LORD shall return, and come to Zion with songs and everlasting joy upon their heads: they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

#### **Psalm: 85 (446)**

1 LORD, thou art become gracious unto thy land; \* thou hast turned away the captivity of Jacob.

2 Thou hast forgiven the offence of thy people, \* and covered all their sins.

3 Thou hast taken away all thy displeasure, \* and turned thyself from thy wrathful indignation.

4 Turn us then, O God our Saviour, \* and let thine anger cease from us.

5 Wilt thou be displeased at us for ever? \* and wilt thou stretch out thy wrath from one generation to another?

6 Wilt thou not turn again, and quicken us, \* that thy people may rejoice in thee?

7 Show us thy mercy, O LORD, \* and grant us thy salvation.

8 I will hearken what the LORD God will say; \* for he shall speak peace unto his people, and to his saints, that they turn not again unto foolishness.

9 For his salvation is nigh them that fear him; \* that glory may dwell in our land.

10 Mercy and truth are met together: \* righteousness and peace have kissed each other.

11 Truth shall flourish out of the earth, \* and righteousness hath looked down from heaven.

12 Yea, the LORD shall show loving-kindness; \* and our land shall give her increase.

13 Righteousness shall go before him, \* and shall direct his going in the way.

### **Epistle: 1 Corinthians 4: 1-5**

<sup>4</sup> Let a man so account of us, as of the ministers of Christ, and stewards of the mysteries of God.

<sup>2</sup> Moreover it is required in stewards, that a man be found faithful.

<sup>3</sup> But with me it is a very small thing that I should be judged of you, or of man's judgment: yea, I judge not mine own self.

<sup>4</sup> For I know nothing by myself; yet am I not hereby justified: but he that judgeth me is the Lord.

<sup>5</sup> Therefore judge nothing before the time, until the Lord come, who both will bring to light the hidden things of darkness, and will make manifest the counsels of the hearts: and then shall every man have praise of God.

### **Advent 4 12/21/2025**

#### **Old Testament: Isaiah 40:1-11**

<sup>40</sup> Comfort ye, comfort ye my people, saith your God.

<sup>2</sup> Speak ye comfortably to Jerusalem, and cry unto her, that her warfare is accomplished, that her iniquity is pardoned: for she hath received of the LORD's hand double for all her sins.

<sup>3</sup> The voice of him that crieth in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

<sup>4</sup> Every valley shall be exalted, and every mountain and hill shall be made low: and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough places plain:

<sup>5</sup> And the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together: for the mouth of the LORD hath spoken it.

<sup>6</sup>The voice said, Cry. And he said, What shall I cry? All flesh is grass, and all the goodliness thereof is as the flower of the field:

<sup>7</sup>The grass withereth, the flower fadeth: because the spirit of the LORD bloweth upon it: surely the people is grass.

<sup>8</sup>The grass withereth, the flower fadeth: but the word of our God shall stand for ever.

<sup>9</sup>O Zion, that bringest good tidings, get thee up into the high mountain; O Jerusalem, that bringest good tidings, lift up thy voice with strength; lift it up, be not afraid; say unto the cities of Judah, Behold your God!

<sup>10</sup>Behold, the Lord God will come with strong hand, and his arm shall rule for him: behold, his reward is with him, and his work before him.

<sup>11</sup>He shall feed his flock like a shepherd: he shall gather the lambs with his arm, and carry them in his bosom, and shall gently lead those that are with young.

### **Psalm: 77 (433)**

1 I WILL cry unto God with my voice; \* even unto God will I cry with my voice, and he shall hearken unto me.

2 In the time of my trouble I sought the Lord: \* I stretched forth my hands unto him, and ceased not in the night season; my soul refused comfort.

3 When I am in heaviness, I will think upon God; \* when my heart is vexed, I will complain.

4 Thou holdest mine eyes waking: \* I am so feeble that I cannot speak.

5 I have considered the days of old, \* and the years that are past.

6 I call to remembrance my song, \* and in the night I commune with mine own heart, and search out my spirit.

7 Will the Lord absent himself for ever? \* and will he be no more intreated?

8 Is his mercy clean gone for ever? \* and is his promise come utterly to an end for evermore?

9 Hath God forgotten to be gracious? \* and will he shut up his loving-kindness in displeasure?

10 And I said, It is mine own infirmity; \* but I will re-member the years of the right hand of the Most Highest.

11 I will remember the works of the LORD, \* and call to mind thy wonders of old time.

12 I will think also of all thy works, \* and my talking shall be of thy doings.

13 Thy way, O God, is holy: \* who is so great a God as our God?

14 Thou art the God that doest wonders, \* and hast declared thy power among the peoples.

## **Epistle: Philippians 4:4-7**

they are coming, gathered from east and west,  
at the word of the Holy One,  
rejoicing in the glory of God.

<sup>5</sup> Take off the garment of your sorrow and affliction, O Jerusalem,  
and put on for ever the beauty of the glory from God.

<sup>2</sup> Put on the robe of the righteousness that comes from God;  
put on your head the diadem of the glory of the Everlasting;

<sup>7</sup> For God has ordered that every high mountain and the everlasting hills be made low

and the valleys filled up, to make level ground,

so that Israel may walk safely in the glory of God.

<sup>8</sup> The woods and every fragrant tree

have shaded Israel at God's command.

<sup>9</sup> For God will lead Israel with joy,

in the light of his glory,

with the mercy and righteousness that come from him.

### **Psalm: 50: 1-15 (BCP 401)**

1 THE LORD, even the Most Mighty God, hath spoken, \* and called the world, from the rising up of the sun unto the going down thereof.

2 Out of Sion hath God appeared \* in perfect beauty.

3 Our God shall come, and shall not keep silence; \* there shall go before him a consuming fire, and a mighty tempest shall be stirred up round about him.

4 He shall call the heaven from above, \* and the earth, that he may judge his people.

5 Gather my saints together unto me; \* those that have made a covenant with me with sacrifice.

6 And the heavens shall declare his righteousness; \* for God is Judge himself.

## **Epistle: Hebrew 1: 1-12**

**1** God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets,

**2** Hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son, whom he hath appointed heir of all things, by whom also he made the worlds;

**3** Who being the brightness of his glory, and the express image of his person, and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he had by himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high:

**4** Being made so much better than the angels, as he hath by inheritance obtained a more excellent name than they.

**5** For unto which of the angels said he at any time, Thou art my Son, this day have I begotten thee? And again, I will be to him a Father, and he shall be to me a Son?

**6** And again, when he bringeth in the firstbegotten into the world, he saith, And let all the angels of God worship him.

**7** And of the angels he saith, Who maketh his angels spirits, and his ministers a flame of fire.

**8** But unto the Son he saith, Thy throne, O God, is for ever and ever: a sceptre of righteousness is the sceptre of thy kingdom.

**9** Thou hast loved righteousness, and hated iniquity; therefore God, even thy God, hath anointed thee with the oil of gladness above thy fellows.

**10** And, Thou, Lord, in the beginning hast laid the foundation of the earth; and the heavens are the works of thine hands:

**11** They shall perish; but thou remainest; and they all shall wax old as doth a garment;

**12** And as a vesture shalt thou fold them up, and they shall be changed: but thou art the same, and thy years shall not fail.

**Christmas Day 12/25/2025**

**Old Testament: Isaiah 9:2-7**

<sup>2</sup> The people that walked in darkness have seen a great light: they that dwell in the land of the shadow of death, upon them hath the light shined.

<sup>3</sup> Thou hast multiplied the nation, and not increased the joy: they joy before thee according to the joy in harvest, and as men rejoice when they divide the spoil.

<sup>4</sup> For thou hast broken the yoke of his burden, and the staff of his shoulder, the rod of his oppressor, as in the day of Midian.

<sup>5</sup> For every battle of the warrior is with confused noise, and garments rolled in blood; but this shall be with burning and fuel of fire.

<sup>6</sup> For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.

<sup>7</sup> Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon his kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even for ever. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will perform this.

**Psalm: 89: 1-19 (450)**

MY song shall be alway of the loving-kindness of the LORD; \* with my mouth will I ever be showing thy truth from one generation to another.

2 For I have said, Mercy shall be set up for ever; \* thy truth shalt thou stablish in the heavens.

3 I have made a covenant with my chosen; \* I have sworn unto David my servant:

4 Thy seed will I stablish for ever, \* and set up thy throne from one generation to another.

5 O LORD, the very heavens shall praise thy wondrous works; \* and thy truth in the congregation of the saints.

6 For who is he among the clouds, \* that shall be compared unto the LORD?

7 And what is he among the gods, \* that shall be like unto the LORD?

8 God is very greatly to be feared in the council of the saints, \* and to be had in reverence of all them that are round about him.

9 O Lord God of hosts, who is like unto thee? \* thy truth, most mighty LORD, is on every side.

10 Thou rulest the raging of the sea; \* thou stillest the waves thereof when they arise.

11 Thou hast subdued Egypt, and destroyed it; \* thou hast scattered thine enemies abroad with thy mighty arm.

12 The heavens are thine, the earth also is thine; \* thou hast laid the foundation of the round world, and all that therein is.

13 Thou hast made the north and the south; \* Tabor and Hermon shall rejoice in thy Name.  
14 Thou hast a mighty arm; \* strong is thy hand, and high is thy right hand.  
15 Righteousness and equity are the habitation of thy seat; \* mercy and truth shall go before thy face.  
16 Blessed is the people, O LORD, that can rejoice in thee; \* they shall walk in the light of thy countenance.  
17 Their delight shall be daily in thy Name; \* and in thy righteousness shall they make their boast.  
18 For thou art the glory of their strength, \* and in thy loving-kindness thou shalt lift up our horns.  
19 For the LORD is our defence; \* the Holy One of Israel is our King.

### **1<sup>st</sup> Sunday after Christmas 12/28/2025**

#### **Old Testament: Isaiah 49:8-13**

<sup>8</sup> Thus saith the LORD, In an acceptable time have I heard thee, and in a day of salvation have I helped thee: and I will preserve thee, and give thee for a covenant of the people, to establish the earth, to cause to inherit the desolate heritages;  
<sup>9</sup> That thou mayest say to the prisoners, Go forth; to them that are in darkness, Shew yourselves. They shall feed in the ways, and their pastures shall be in all high places.  
<sup>10</sup> They shall not hunger nor thirst; neither shall the heat nor sun smite them: for he that hath mercy on them shall lead them, even by the springs of water shall he guide them.  
<sup>11</sup> And I will make all my mountains a way, and my highways shall be exalted.

<sup>12</sup> Behold, these shall come from far: and, lo, these from the north and from the west; and these from the land of Sinim.

<sup>13</sup> Sing, O heavens; and be joyful, O earth; and break forth into singing, O mountains: for the LORD hath comforted his people, and will have mercy upon his afflicted.

### **Psalm: 145 vs 1-13 (520)**

1 I WILL magnify thee, O God, my King; \* and I will praise thy Name for ever and ever.

2 Every day will I give thanks unto thee; \* and praise thy Name for ever and ever.

4 One generation shall praise thy works unto another, \* and declare thy power.

### **Epistle: Galatians 4:1-7**

<sup>3</sup> Even so we, when we were children, were in bondage under the elements of the world:

<sup>4</sup> But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law,

<sup>5</sup> To redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons.

<sup>6</sup> And because ye are sons, God hath sent forth the Spirit of his Son into your hearts, crying, Abba, Father.

<sup>7</sup> Wherefore thou art no more a servant, but a son; and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ.
