Father Michael's Musings **December 2024**



"Peace on Earth, Goodwill to Men!" That was the declaration of the angels to the shepherds at the birth of Jesus. In fact, the decades before the birth of Jesus were unprecedented for the reality of peace. The Romans and Jews were at an uneasy truce. The wise men travelled from the East without difficulty. Joseph and Mary were able to emigrate to Egypt without navigating a war zone. Instead of invading armies, the Greeks, Persians, Egyptians, and Arab nations sent emissaries and trade.

How far it seems we have fallen. The whole world seems to be at war. The Middle East is on fire. Russia and Ukraine have all of Europe at the edge of a World War. China rattles sabers over Taiwan and instigates skirmishes with our military. North Korea fires missiles over South Korea and Japan. It seems that despite our short respite from war at the birth of Jesus, that we are powerless to stop the constant destruction and atrocities that are the inevitable by-products of these conflicts.

But, that is not really true. Every one of these wars is fueled by the aggregation of very human grass roots hatred, greed, ambition, and fear. The powers who instigate and sustain the wars are agents of evil. They fan the fires of our personal and local rage and fears to put leaders in place who will trade on our biases to separate us from our neighbors, and who will manipulate us with rising prices of the staples we need to justify aggression against traditional enemies. We are manipulated into righteous indignation by the terrible lies of our media, regardless of which side they represent. But the truth is that these powerful leaders, omnipresent influencers, and merchants of death only have power because they reflect and aggregate our personal unhappiness and fear. They are the top of the pyramid of hateful war, but they are only held in place by our tolerance and inaction.

Fifty years ago, it was the mothers, who had lost children to the troubles in Ireland, who finally said they had had enough and decided to work together for peace. I suspect it will be the mothers of Israeli and Palestinian casualties that will ultimately do the same. The merchants of death will reach the point where selling oil to Ukraine and food to Russia makes more sense than destroying cities to keep prices high through continuing the conflict. It will again be mothers and children as agents of change to save generations going forward.

We can contribute as well. Tolerance, patience and understanding in our families and neighborhoods would reduce the groundswell of anger and fear that lifts up these agents of evil. Simple charity and kindness are the water hoses aimed at the forest fire. When enough hoses finally are concentrated on quenching the fire, it will be extinguished. Reducing hatred and fear and anger in our own lives takes power away from those who cherish war.

We also can pray, earnestly and relentlessly, for peace. Prayer is our greatest weapon, more powerful than media influence, bombs or starvation. We may not be able to topple the great forces of evil and hatred by ourselves, but they are subject to the judgment of God. If we turn to Him for relief, He will answer our prayers and return peace to His people.

I hope everyone that reads this will join us at St. Patrick's this Advent and Christmas as we pray for the restoration of peace. Please join us at our services and become part of our community. If you don't find St. Patrick's to be your inspiration, still, go to the church you prefer, and we can all join together as God's people, petitioning Him for peace for our time and the times of our children.





Sunday Adult Teaching
