### **Trinity 3 (Independence Day) 07/06/2025**

**Old Testament:** Isaiah 26: 1-4, 7-8, 12

26 In that day shall this song be sung in the land of Judah; We have a strong city; salvation will God appoint for walls and bulwarks.

<sup>2</sup> Open ye the gates, that the righteous nation which keepeth the truth may enter in.

<sup>3</sup> Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee: because he trusteth in thee.

<sup>4</sup> Trust ye in the LORD for ever: for in the LORD JEHOVAH is everlasting strength:

<sup>7</sup> The way of the just is uprightness: thou, most upright, dost weigh the path of the just.

<sup>8</sup> Yea, in the way of thy judgments, O LORD, have we waited for thee; the desire of our soul is to thy name, and to the remembrance of thee.

<sup>12</sup> LORD, thou wilt ordain peace for us: for thou also hast wrought all our works in us.

**Psalm: 18: 1-20 (359)**

I WILL love thee, O LORD, my strength. \* The LORD is my stony rock, and my defence;

2 My Saviour, my God, and my might, in whom I will trust; \* my buckler, the horn also of my salvation, and my refuge.

3 I will call upon the LORD, which is worthy to be praised; \* so shall I be safe from mine enemies.

4 The sorrows of death compassed me, \* and the overflowings of ungodliness made me afraid.

5 The pains of hell came about me; \* the snares of death overtook me.

6 In my trouble I called upon the LORD, \* and complained unto my God:

7 So he heard my voice out of his holy temple, \* and my complaint came before him; it entered even into his

ears.

8 The earth trembled and quaked, \* the very foundations also of the hills shook, and were removed, because he was wroth.

9 There went a smoke out in his presence, \* and a consuming fire out of his mouth, so that coals were kindled at it.

10 He bowed the heavens also, and came down, \* and it was dark under his feet.

11 He rode upon the Cherubim, and did fly; \* he came flying upon the wings of the wind.

12 He made darkness his secret place, \* his pavilion round about him with dark water, and thick clouds to cover him.

13 At the brightness of his presence his clouds removed; \* hailstones and coals of fire.

14 The LORD also thundered out of heaven, and the Highest gave his thunder; \* hailstones and coals of fire.

15 He sent out his arrows, and scattered them; \* he cast forth lightnings, and destroyed them.

16 The springs of waters were seen, and the foundations of the round world were discovered, \* at thy chiding, O LORD, at the blasting of the breath of thy displeasure.

17 He sent down from on high to fetch me, \* and took me out of many waters.

18 He delivered me from my strongest enemy, and from them which hate me; \* for they were too mighty for me.

19 They came upon me in the day of my trouble; \* but the LORD was my upholder.

20 He brought me forth also into a place of liberty; \* he brought me forth, even because he had a favour unto me.

**Epistle:** Deuteronomy 10: 17-21

<sup>17</sup> For the LORD your God is God of gods, and Lord of lords, a great God, a mighty, and a terrible, which regardeth not persons, nor taketh reward:

<sup>18</sup> He doth execute the judgment of the fatherless and widow, and loveth the stranger, in giving him food and raiment.

<sup>19</sup> Love ye therefore the stranger: for ye were strangers in the land of Egypt.

<sup>20</sup> Thou shalt fear the LORD thy God; him shalt thou serve, and to him shalt thou cleave, and swear by his name.

<sup>21</sup> He is thy praise, and he is thy God, that hath done for thee these great and terrible things, which thine eyes have seen.

**Trinity 4: 07/13/2025**

**Old Testament: Lamentations 3:22-33**

<sup>22</sup> It is of the LORD's mercies that we are not consumed, because his compassions fail not.

<sup>23</sup> They are new every morning: great is thy faithfulness.

<sup>24</sup> The LORD is my portion, saith my soul; therefore will I hope in him.

<sup>25</sup> The LORD is good unto them that wait for him, to the soul that seeketh him.

<sup>26</sup> It is good that a man should both hope and quietly wait for the salvation of the LORD.

<sup>27</sup> It is good for a man that he bear the yoke in his youth.

<sup>28</sup> He sitteth alone and keepeth silence, because he hath borne it upon him.

<sup>29</sup> He putteth his mouth in the dust; if so be there may be hope.

<sup>30</sup> He giveth his cheek to him that smiteth him: he is filled full with reproach.

<sup>31</sup> For the LORD will not cast off for ever:

<sup>32</sup> But though he cause grief, yet will he have compassion according to the multitude of his mercies.

<sup>33</sup> For he doth not afflict willingly nor grieve the children of men.

**Psalm: 75 (BCP 431)**

UNTO thee, O God, do we give thanks; \* yea, unto thee do we give thanks.

2 Thy Name also is so nigh; \* and that do thy wondrous works declare.

3 In the appointed time, saith God, \* I shall judge according unto right.

4 The earth is weak, and all the inhabitants thereof: \* I bear up the pillars of it.

5 I said unto the fools, Deal not so madly; \* and to the ungodly, Set not up your horn.

6 Set not up your horn on high, \* and speak not with a stiff neck.

7 For promotion cometh neither from the east, nor from the west, \* nor yet from the south.

8 And why? God is the Judge; \* he putteth down one, and setteth up another.

9 For in the hand of the LORD there is a cup, and the wine is red; \* it is full mixt, and he poureth out of the same.

10 As for the dregs thereof, \* all the ungodly of the earth shall drink them, and suck them out.

11 But I will talk of the God of Jacob, \* and praise him for ever.

12 All the horns of the ungodly also will I break, \* and the horns of the righteous shall be exalted

## **Epistle: Romans 8:18-23**

<sup>18</sup> For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us.

<sup>19</sup> For the earnest expectation of the creature waiteth for the manifestation of the sons of God.

<sup>20</sup> For the creature was made subject to vanity, not willingly, but by reason of him who hath subjected the same in hope,

<sup>21</sup> Because the creature itself also shall be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God.

<sup>22</sup> For we know that the whole creation groaneth and travaileth in pain together until now.

<sup>23</sup> And not only they, but ourselves also, which have the firstfruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting for the adoption, to wit, the redemption of our body.

## **Trinity 5: 07/20/2025**

### **Old Testament: Ecclesiastes 2:1-11,18-23**

I said in mine heart, Go to now, I will prove thee with mirth, therefore enjoy pleasure: and, behold, this also is vanity.

<sup>2</sup> I said of laughter, It is mad: and of mirth, What doeth it?

<sup>3</sup> I sought in mine heart to give myself unto wine, yet acquainting mine heart with wisdom; and to lay hold on folly, till I might see what was that good for the sons of men, which they should do under the heaven all the days of their life.

<sup>4</sup> I made me great works; I builded me houses; I planted me vineyards:

<sup>5</sup> I made me gardens and orchards, and I planted trees in them of all kind of fruits:

<sup>6</sup> I made me pools of water, to water therewith the wood that bringeth forth trees:

<sup>7</sup> I got me servants and maidens, and had servants born in my house; also I had great possessions of great and small cattle above all that were in Jerusalem before me:

<sup>8</sup> I gathered me also silver and gold, and the peculiar treasure of kings and of the provinces: I gat me men singers and women singers, and the delights of the sons of men, as musical instruments, and that of all sorts.

<sup>9</sup> So I was great, and increased more than all that were before me in Jerusalem: also my wisdom remained with me.

<sup>10</sup> And whatsoever mine eyes desired I kept not from them, I withheld not my heart from any joy; for my heart rejoiced in all my labour: and this was my portion of all my labour.

<sup>11</sup> Then I looked on all the works that my hands had wrought, and on the labour that I had laboured to do: and, behold, all was vanity and vexation of spirit, and there was no profit under the sun.

<sup>18</sup> Yea, I hated all my labour which I had taken under the sun: because I should leave it unto the man that shall be after me.

<sup>19</sup> And who knoweth whether he shall be a wise man or a fool? yet shall he have rule over all my labour wherein I have laboured, and wherein I have shewed myself wise under the sun. This is also vanity.

<sup>20</sup> Therefore I went about to cause my heart to despair of all the labour which I took under the sun.

<sup>21</sup> For there is a man whose labour is in wisdom, and in knowledge, and in equity; yet to a man that hath not laboured therein shall he leave it for his portion. This also is vanity and a great evil.

<sup>22</sup> For what hath man of all his labour, and of the vexation of his heart, wherein he hath laboured under the sun?

<sup>23</sup> For all his days are sorrows, and his travail grief; yea, his heart taketh not rest in the night. This is also vanity.

### **Psalms: 62 (BCP 413)**

MY soul truly waiteth still upon God; \* for of him cometh my salvation.

2 He verily is my strength and my salvation; \* he is my defence, so that I shall not greatly fall.

3 How long will ye imagine mischief against every man? \* Ye shall be slain all the sort of you; yea, as a tottering wall shall ye be, and like a broken hedge.

4 Their device is only how to put him out whom God will exalt; \* their delight is in lies; they give good words with their mouth, but curse with their heart.

5 Nevertheless, my soul, wait thou still upon God; \* for my hope is in him.

6 He truly is my strength and my salvation; \* he is my defence, so that I shall not fall.

7 In God is my health and my glory; \* the rock of my might; and in God is my trust.

8 O put your trust in him alway, ye people; \* pour out your hearts before him, for God is our hope.

9 As for the children of men, they are but vanity; the children of men are deceitful; \* upon the weights they are altogether lighter than vanity itself.

10 O trust not in wrong and robbery; give not yourselves unto vanity: \* if riches increase, set not your heart upon them.

11 God spake once, and twice I have also heard the same, \* that power belongeth unto God;

12 And that thou, Lord, art merciful; \* for thou rewardest every man according to his work.

### **Epistle: 1 Peter 3:8-15**

<sup>8</sup> Finally, be ye all of one mind, having compassion one of another, love as brethren, be pitiful, be courteous:

<sup>9</sup> Not rendering evil for evil, or railing for railing: but contrariwise blessing; knowing that ye are thereunto called, that ye should inherit a blessing.

<sup>10</sup> For he that will love life, and see good days, let him refrain his tongue from evil, and his lips that they speak no guile:

<sup>11</sup> Let him eschew evil, and do good; let him seek peace, and ensue it.

<sup>12</sup> For the eyes of the Lord are over the righteous, and his ears are open unto their prayers: but the face of the Lord is against them that do evil.

<sup>13</sup> And who is he that will harm you, if ye be followers of that which is good?

<sup>14</sup> But and if ye suffer for righteousness' sake, happy are ye: and be not afraid of their terror, neither be troubled;

<sup>15</sup> But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear:

### **Trinity 6: 07/27/2025**

#### **Old Testament: Isaiah 57:13-19**

<sup>13</sup> When thou criest, let thy companies deliver thee; but the wind shall carry them all away; vanity shall take them: but he that putteth his trust in me shall possess the land, and shall inherit my holy mountain;

<sup>14</sup> And shall say, Cast ye up, cast ye up, prepare the way, take up the stumblingblock out of the way of my people.

<sup>15</sup> For thus saith the high and lofty One that inhabiteth eternity, whose name is Holy; I dwell in the high and holy place, with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble, and to revive the heart of the contrite ones.

<sup>16</sup> For I will not contend for ever, neither will I be always wroth: for the spirit should fail before me, and the souls which I have made.

<sup>17</sup> For the iniquity of his covetousness was I wroth, and smote him: I hid me, and was wroth, and he went on frowardly in the way of his heart.

<sup>18</sup> I have seen his ways, and will heal him: I will lead him also, and restore comforts unto him and to his mourners.

<sup>19</sup> I create the fruit of the lips; Peace, peace to him that is far off, and to him that is near, saith the LORD; and I will heal him.

#### **Psalm: 85 (BCP 446)**

LORD, thou art become gracious unto thy land; \* thou hast turned away the captivity of Jacob.

2 Thou hast forgiven the offence of thy people, \* and covered all their sins.

3 Thou hast taken away all thy displeasure, \* and turned thyself from thy wrathful indignation.

4 Turn us then, O God our Saviour, \* and let thine anger cease from us.

5 Wilt thou be displeased at us for ever? \* and wilt thou stretch out thy wrath from one generation to another?

6 Wilt thou not turn again, and quicken us, \* that thy people may rejoice in thee?

7 Show us thy mercy, O LORD, \* and grant us thy salvation.

8 I will hearken what the LORD God will say; \* for he shall speak peace unto his people, and to his saints, that they turn not again unto foolishness.

9 For his salvation is nigh them that fear him; \* that glory may dwell in our land.

10 Mercy and truth are met together: \* righteousness and peace have kissed each other.

11 Truth shall flourish out of the earth, \* and righteousness hath looked down from heaven.

12 Yea, the LORD shall show loving-kindness; \* and our land shall give her increase.

13 Righteousness shall go before him, \* and shall direct his going in the way.

### **Epistle: Romans 6:3-11**

<sup>3</sup> Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death?

<sup>4</sup> Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life.

<sup>5</sup> For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall be also in the likeness of his resurrection:

<sup>6</sup> Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with him, that the body of sin might be destroyed, that henceforth we should not serve sin.

<sup>7</sup> For he that is dead is freed from sin.

<sup>8</sup> Now if we be dead with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him:

<sup>9</sup> Knowing that Christ being raised from the dead dieth no more; death hath no more dominion over him.

<sup>10</sup> For in that he died, he died unto sin once: but in that he liveth, he liveth unto God.

<sup>11</sup> Likewise reckon ye also yourselves to be dead indeed unto sin, but alive unto God through Jesus Christ our Lord.
