As we progress from Lenten and Easter observances into the month of May, we have two very important remembrances that are dear to the Church. We begin the month honoring our mothers, and we close the month with solemn appreciation for those in our Armed Forces who have made the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom on Memorial Day.



Of course, the church shares the observance of Mother's Day with the secular world. It is impossible to overstate the influence, guidance, and love we have been blessed to receive through our mothers. But for the church, Mother's Day has an additional meaning. Jesus tells us that the mystery of marriage is that the bond that makes a man and a woman one in the eyes of God is given to us as a symbol of the way that we are made one in Christ through the marriage of God and His Church.
