Father Michael's Musings April 2024

At the birth of Our Lord, the angels sang "Peace on earth, good will toward men". Indeed, the years during which Jesus walked the earth were the rare example of worldwide peace. Before He came, and in the years since His Ascension, the rule of man was marked by war after war, violence upon violence. We know that at the end of our lives we rest in peace, and that at the Second Coming, the peace of God will be imposed on all of Creation. The question remains though, as to whether we will ever again have the respite of peace in our lives and in our world.



Our last decades have seen the added complication of war manifested by ideologies and anarchism as well as the potential of war between states. The potential now is that state developed weapons, nuclear arms, biological weapons and even artificial intelligence, can be co-opted and unleashed upon the world by fanatic and anarchic splinter groups. From the sadness of 9-11, to the atrocities of Hamas last year, to the savagery of the murders in Moscow last month, the world seems committed to self-destruction and endless violence.

The incredible courage of Christians is that we face this world with faith and hope, not only for peace after time, but for the reign of peace by the power of God in our times. Our weapons to combat the savagery are charity and prayer. Persistent kindness, without concern for compensation, is a change agent. The Palestinians and Jews who share business and gardens will be more powerful in creating peace than all the weapons the US and Iran can pour into the region. Feeding the millions starving in Africa is the only way to keep entire populations from becoming weaponized as starving refugees. It was mothers who had had enough of losing children to senseless war that ended the "Troubles" in Ireland and will end the war in Ukraine.

As Christians we make the mistake of thinking of prayer as our last resort. We offer prayers to people when we don't have any other way to ease their suffering. The Truth is that prayer is our most powerful weapon. In fact, it is our only hope to prevent suffering, not our last hope to minimize that suffering. We need to be earnest in our prayer, persistent in our prayer and faithful in our prayer if we hope to secure God's intercession on our behalf against the powers that are too great for us to defeat by ourselves.

This year, every Mass at St Patrick's will be dedicated to peace in the world, peace in the Middle East, peace in Eastern Europe, peace in our neighborhoods, peace within our families and in our own hearts. We invite you to join us, at St. Patrick's if you can come, but in prayer regardless, as we make this a year of prayer for peace, so that the years to come can be years of peace for all.
