<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>15</sup> As the Father knoweth me, even so know I the Father: and I lay down my life for the sheep.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>16</sup> And other sheep I have, which are not of this fold: them also I must bring, and they shall hear my voice; and there shall be one fold, and one shepherd.

Season/Date: Easter 3 (St. Mark)/April 25th

Old Testament: 1 Samuel 2: 1b-10
