Growing up, September was the beginning of the school year, replacing the final doldrums and boredom of summer with new beginnings and old routines. August fills that role for our grandchildren now, so the thread of this musings is common to both months. The beginning of school brought both anxiety and excitement. There were new teachers, new courses, sometimes even new schools as we worked from kindergarten to college. However, along with those new experiences were renewals of old friendships, and especially re-starting the

# Student Sunday School


