FATHER MIKE'S MUSING

As the calendar turns to December, Christians turn their focus to the celebration of Christmas. The remembrance of the Nativity of our Lord is one of the most significant Holy days on the Church calendar. At St. Patrick's, we will work with the children on a new bell choir for the Children's service at 6 PM on Christmas Eve. Those of us who are a little older will



look forward to Midnight Mass, which will start at 11:30 PM on Christmas Eve, and culminate in the first minutes of Christmas morning. Finally, we will remember those who blessed our past Christmas celebrations by celebrating Mass in the Memorial Garden at 10:00 on Christmas morning. As is usual, the poinsettias that decorate the altar will be dedicated to our loved ones who have passed to their reward ahead of us.

However, the great proportion of the month is the observance of Advent, and that is also a very important part of the Church calendar. While Christmas looks back to the Nativity, the season of Advent is dedicated to looking forward in preparation for the return of Jesus at His Second Coming. Advent is the season to consider our end, both the end of our time here on earth but also the end, or purpose, of our personal Creation.

2020 has brought great challenges. We have battled the pandemic ,and the economic and social havoc wrought by the response to the illness. The normal pattern of cataclysms that we encounter seems to have been more vicious. More fires, more flooding, more hurricanes here in Florida than we have recorded at any other time. I have been asked many times this year if we are approaching the Apocalypse, the end of time and return of Christ. Of course, I don't have that answer. As Jesus told the Apostles, the answer to that question is not on anyone's sign or web site. Only the Father knows the time He has set. We do know however, that whether the world is ending or not, that we are always getting nearer to the end of our own individual lives.

Taking time to think and pray about how we will meet that end, and how the purpose for which we were created will be fulfilled, are timely and worthwhile pursuits. As we fight our way through the stores, scramble for addresses for Christmas cards, and battle to keep Christ in our Christmas celebrations, we need to also look forward to how we are preparing to meet Him at His return. I wish all of you a Holy and insightful Advent season, and all the blessings that God can bestow upon us for Christmas as well. I look forward to being with you on Christmas.
