FATHER MIKE'S MUSING

In the coverage of the Presidential transition, I have been interested in the way the press handles President Biden's faith. Either the press condemns Mr. Biden for supporting legislation that is counter to the tenets of the catholic faith, or they use the same positions to attack the Roman Church. Regardless of which way your politics are inclined, this is a vivid reminder that the world closely watches those of us who proclaim the Christian faith. It may be that the motivation is antagonism to our Christian principles, but I

also believe an important element of this scrutiny is hon-

est curiosity, but motivated by the effort to rationalize



their skepticism and to reinforce the rejection of the hypocrisy that non-believers have encountered. I believe there is a true and clear motivation for people who are inclined to believe the teachings of Christ but repulsed by the examples of the lives we lead as Christians to measure us, and to test the strength of our faith.

Honestly, this is how it should be. We should be tested and observed and measured by the world. The growth of the Christian faith was promulgated by the Apostles, who were willing to give up their careers and ultimately their lives for their beliefs. Even though their faith led to suffering and punishment, their witness resulted in the conversion of the world. The power of reflecting the grace and blessings we receive back to the world as Christian charity and understanding sustains that conversion. Throughout history, the willingness of Christians to act against their self-interest, to be kind in the face of insult, to persevere with grace through persecution, have been the most powerful antidotes to the skepticism of the world. Many souls have been won because good Christian men and women were caught being good Christians.

I hope we will remember that we are all under constant observation. If the expression of our victories results in generosity and kindness, the Gospel will be well preached. If we can sustain grace and civility in our defeats, the Gospel will have been equally well preached. We are the keepers of the peace that passes all understanding. How we express that peace not only determines how we fare test the world presents, but also will draw the world closer to the desire to experience Christ and to share our communion. Now is the very best time in our lives to proclaim the Gospel by our actions and our words. May we be judged as good and faithful Christians by those who are watching.
