It might interesting to learn that the term, "dog days of summer", has dual astrological significance. The Greeks connected the month to the rising of Sirius, the Dog Star, and connected August to heat, drought, thunderstorms and bad temper. The Egyptians also looked to Sirius, but as the harbinger of the annual flooding of the Nile. The overflowing of the Nile brought fertile soil into the farmlands, but while it benefitted the Egyptians, it was also problematic. In modern times, the dog days refer to the lack of energy and motivation that result from dealing with the heat and humidity.
