Father Michael's Musings

On Independence Day holiday, which we celebrate as the 4th of July, many people will join in singing God Bless America. Many will stand and pledge to be "one Nation under God". A few will even sing our National Hymn, which includes the verse, "long may our land be bright, with freedom's holy light, protect us by thy might, great God our King". These beautiful and patriotic songs should cause us to reflect on what our responsibility might be to preserve an America that God would bless. Fortunately, God does not leave us to guess His intentions or his expectations of us. We can usually find the answers we seek in familiar passages in our Bibles.



We all can see that we have strayed far from the Christian nation envisioned by our Founding Fathers. The culture promotes values that are destructive, sometimes even demonic. Those of us who have been around for a while have developed a cynicism that makes it hard to be receptive to patriotic messages. And yet, God has blessed our country and has continued to do so. Whether He will continue to bless America, actually falls upon our own heads.

When God was fed up with the terrible cultures, values and behaviors of Sodom and Gomorrah, He told His faithful servant Abraham that he was going to punish those cities. Abraham boldly argued with God, and challenged Him with the proposition that if he could find 50 righteous people, wouldn't God save the cities for their sakes. God agreed that he would spare the cities, but Abraham argued on, what if it was only 45 righteous, then 30, then 20 and finally it was agreed God would save the cities if only there were 10 righteous people. Sadly, Abraham could not find that many, and the cities met the fate they brought upon themselves.

The point of repeating this encounter between God and Abraham is to remind us that while we may not know how many righteous people God requires to save our country and continue to bless us, that He will do so for even a few righteous souls. It is incumbent upon us to be those righteous souls. By doing so, we give not only ourselves, but all those we love who have yet to embrace righteousness, to be saved and to be blessed. Please join me in praying that, when God goes out to count the righteous souls, that he can count on us.
