Father Michael's Musings

It makes sense to us that Christian Churches would share many common elements. We share the same Scripture. We share the need to pray together and in public services. We have preaching and teaching in common. Almost all churches share the joy of the angels' voice that is echoed through our musical tradition of praise and thanksgiving. Yet despite so many common elements, each church also has distinguishing and unique characteristics that are reflected in the worship and in their organization. One of the elements that separate the identity and practice of a church is its polity.



Polity is the governance of the Church. In ancient and orthodox churches, the polity reflects what that Church has gleaned from Scripture. Good polity is founded upon Scriptural teaching, precedent and insights so that the followers can govern themselves as they would be governed in the presence of Jesus if He were alive today.

Some churches follow a top down structure in which the Church hierarchy owns and controls all aspects of Church life. The Roman Catholic and Episcopal Churches share that structure. At the other end of the spectrum are some Evangelical churches in which the parishioners control everything and for whom their ministers are employees. The extreme form of this type of Church are Quakers and Congregationalists. Baptists, Methodists and Presbyterian churches are less extreme examples of churches who are governed more by their Laity than the clergy. Anglican polity takes slightly different approach. The Clergy are organized in Dioceses led by a Bishop. The Diocese is local in nature, sometimes a city or region, or in our case, several states. The Bishop leads the spiritual life of the church and dictates its worship and practice to, and through, its priests. However, the property of the churches, and the care of the building and its assets are the responsibility of the Laity. The congregation elects a Vestry, which works independently of the Clergy to administer the earthly needs of the Church. A local Church requires a cooperative governance between the Laity who own and control the property, and the clergy, who perform the services and minister to the spiritual needs of the Congregation. If there is disagreement, the Bishop mediates between the Laity and Clergy to find an agreement that is consistent with Church polity and the needs of local congregation. To operate in that cooperative environment, the Diocese meets annually to pray for each other, and to conduct the business of the local churches and the Diocese. There are three houses represented at that annual meeting, which is called a Synod.

The Bishop is one House, priests and Deacons are the House of Clergy, and the Congregation is represented by the House of Laity. Any changes to organization and policies must be approved by all three houses, which ensure the interest of all the parties are met and the responsibilities for the Church are shared. St Patrick's will host our Diocesan Synod this year. All parishioners are invited to observe the meetings. We will have all three priests and two Lay people representing and voting on our behalf in their respective houses. We will also have Masses each day, as well as Morning and Evening Prayer. I hope will join us in our hosting duties and in the worship services so you can meet and enjoy our brothers and sisters throughout the Diocese. The meeting will be held from June 26-28th . The schedule will be on the web site.
