Father Michael's Musings

March 2024



This year, the Liturgical season of Lent spans the entirety of the month of March. As the month begins, we are late in the second full week of Lent, and the month culminates with the celebration of Easter on the 31st. Many of us are vaguely familiar with the season of Lent. We might know it lasts 40 days, and that it is a time we sacrifice by denying ourselves food or drink that we enjoy, in an effort to get ready to celebrate the joy of the Resurrection on Easter.

However, we may be less familiar with many other of the Church's Lenten traditions and their history. We might ask why the season is 40 days long, what the deal is with ashes on the forehead for Ash Wednesday, what is the difference between fasting and abstinence, what are Stations of the Cross, or why we meditate on the 7 Last Words on Good Friday, or what the prophecies from the Old Testament are that are read on Holy Saturday. We might wonder if these Traditions are faithfully based on Scripture. Perhaps we wonder whether there isn't something we can add to our spiritual lives during Lent, rather than just giving up things we love.

The truth is that understanding these Traditions and Scripture on which they are based can add to the benefit of our Lenten discipline and to our appreciation for the incredible gift of the Resurrection. Every Wednesday evening during March, St. Patrick's will study these Traditions and answer questions we might have about the prayers and practices. The study takes place about 6:30 in the parish Hall, and is accompanied by a supper of bread and home-made soup. Prior to the soup and study, we also pray the Stations of the Cross at 5:30 and celebrate the Eucharist at 6:00 PM.

We invite you to join us on Wednesday evenings, and we especially hope you will celebrate Easter Sunday with us, whether it is the Sunrise Service in our Memorial Garden or the regular celebration inside the Church at 10:00 AM.

May God bless you all with a holy Lent and the most joyous Easter.

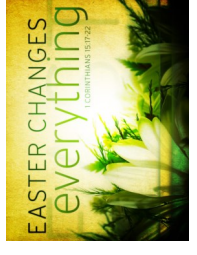
