Father Michael's Musings

The Church has four major Holy Days. We are all familiar with Christmas and Easter, but we might not be as familiar with the other two Holy Days. The third of these Holy Days is Epiphany which is celebrated on January 6th. Epiphany commemorates the arrival of the three wise men to visit the infant Jesus, sacramentally their arrival is the announcement to the Gentiles of the Good News (the Gospel) that the Messiah has arrived, and salvation is extended to all people.

The fourth of the great Holy Days is Pentecost, also called Whitsunday. The Book of the Acts in the Bible contains the writings concerning the Ascension and Pentecost. Following the Resurrection of Jesus on Easter, Jesus remains

with his disciples, teaching and comforting them, for forty days. On the fortieth day, Jesus and his disciples walk to a mountain where he returns to heaven to sit at the right hand of the Father and to prepare a place where we will be with Him, we celebrate this event as the Ascension. Prior to his Ascension, Jesus tells the Apostles that he will send his Holy Spirit, the Comforter, to give them the full understanding of his teaching and the power to establish His Church and preach the Good News. Ten days after the Ascension, the Holy Spirit descends upon the Apostles, as tongues of fire. We learn also from the Book of Acts that although the room was filled with people whose native tongues were different than the Hebrew spoken by the Apostles, each person heard the preaching in their own native tongue. This miracle is the fulfillment of the command that the Gospel should be preached to the whole world, and the Church, as administered by the Apostles, would have the ministry of delivering the Word to all people. The Holy Spirit establishes, empowers and directs the church through the Apostles and their successors. Filled with the Holy Spirit, the Apostles emerged from hiding and boldly preached the Gospel. That gift is the reason we celebrate Pentecost.

We see the commemoration of Pentecost reflected by the Church in several ways. The hat worn by a Bishop is called a Mitre. Since the Bishop is a successor of the Apostles, by training and by special anointing, the Mitre is shaped as the tongue of flame that descended upon each of the Apostles at Pentecost. Pentecost is also a common day for the administration of Confirmation. Confirmation is the time when adults commit to the vows that were made on their behalf to God when they were baptized as children. It marks adult membership in the Church and access to the sacrament of Communion. At confirmation, the confirmand receives a special anointing by the Bishop, which confers the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit; wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord.

Please join us as we celebrate Pentecost on May 19th.
