I was having lunch with Carolyn at Mission Barbecue and noticed a plaque on the wall with a quote from General Peter Pace. "There are those who speak about you and say, he lost an arm, he lost a leg, she lost her sight. I object. You gave your arm, you gave your leg, you gave your sight, as gifts to your nation that we might have our freedom. Thank you, families of the fallen, and families of the wounded. You have sacrificed in a way that those who have not walked in your shoes cannot imagine." This type of introspection should motivate us. We should long to be spoken of with that type of reverence and appreciation. We should strive to live the kind of life that will lead our Lord to say of us, "Well done, my good and faithful servant."
