In October, we stepped out and went to the international community by supporting Change Destiny Life Africa. We raised \$1000 with another \$1000 matched by the Board of CD. What a wonderful gift for the children who live a marginal life on the streets if not for the mission of CD. Our next two events to close out 2021 are a Dinner to honor Bishop Garcia, who is visiting us in November, to meet the parish and to confirm those who are in studies and ready. The dinner is November 13 at 6 PM, each family is asked to bring a side dish of a vegetable or fruit or cheese plate. Chicken with dried beef and water chestnuts over rice will be the main course, that is IF chicken can still be purchased! We implore the entire church body to attend!

Our third ANNUAL Cookie Walk is our final outreach this year, selling pre-bagged homemade cookies and chocolate covered bacon to those walking or driving by.
