Trinity 12 (09/04/2022)

Old Testament[:] Ecclesiasticus 15:11-20

Do not say, "God is responsible for my falling away," for you ought not do [c] what he hates.

- ¹² Do not say, "It was he who led me astray," for he has no need of a sinner.
- ¹³ The LORD hates everything that is abominable, and those who fear him love it not.
- ¹⁴ In the beginning, when God created man, he left him free to make his own decisions.
- ¹⁵ If you choose, you can keep the commandments, and to act faithfully is within your power.
- ¹⁶ He has set before you fire and water; stretch out your hand for whichever you choose.
- ¹⁷ Before each man are life and death, and whichever one he chooses will be given.
- ¹⁸ For great is the wisdom of the LORD; he is mighty in power and all-seeing.
- ¹⁹ His eyes are on those who fear him, and he is aware of every human action.
- ²⁰ He has not commanded anyone to be wicked, and he has given no one permission to sin.

Psalm: 72

GIVE the King thy judgments, O God, * and thy righteousness unto the King's son.

- 2 Then shall he judge thy people according unto right, * and defend the poor.
- 3 The mountains also shall bring peace, * and the little hills righteousness unto the people.
- 4 He shall keep the simple folk by their right, * defend the children of the poor, and punish the wrong doer.
- 5 They shall fear thee, as long as the sun and moon endureth, * from one generation to another.
- 6 He shall come down like the rain upon the mown grass, * even as the drops that water the

earth.

- 7 In his time shall the righteous flourish; * yea, and abundance of peace, so long as the moon endureth.
- 8 His dominion shall be also from the one sea to the other, * and from the River unto the world's end.
- 9 They that dwell in the wilderness shall kneel before him; * his enemies shall lick the dust.
- 10 The kings of Tarshish and of the isles shall give presents; * the kings of Arabia and Saba shall bring gifts.
- 11 All kings shall fall down before him; * all nations shall do him service.
- 12 For he shall deliver the poor when he crieth; * the needy also, and him that hath no helper.
- 13 He shall be favourable to the simple and needy, * and shall preserve the souls of the poor.
- 14 He shall deliver their souls from falsehood and wrong; * and dear shall their blood be in his sight.
- 15 He shall live, and unto him shall be given of the gold of Arabia; * prayer shall be made ever unto him, and daily shall he be praised.
- 16 There shall be an heap of corn in the earth, high upon the hills; the fruit thereof shall shake like Lebanon: * and they of the city shall flourish like grass upon the earth.
- 17 His Name shall endure for ever; his Name shall remain under the sun among the posterities, which shall be blessed in him; * and all the nations shall praise him.
- 18 Blessed be the LORD God, even the God of Israel, * which only doeth wondrous things;
- 19 And blessed be the Name of his majesty for ever: * and all the earth shall be filled with his majesty. Amen, Amen.

Epistle: 2 Corinthians 3:4-9

- ⁴ And such trust have we through Christ to God-ward:
- ⁵ Not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think any thing as of ourselves; but our sufficiency is of God;
- ⁶ Who also hath made us able ministers of the new testament; not of the letter, but of the spirit: for the letter killeth, but the spirit giveth life.
- ⁷ But if the ministration of death, written and engraven in stones, was glorious, so that the children of Israel could not stedfastly behold the face of Moses for the glory of his countenance; which glory was to be done away:
- ⁸ How shall not the ministration of the spirit be rather glorious?
- ⁹ For if the ministration of condemnation be glory, much more doth the ministration of righteousness exceed in glory.

Gospel: Mark 7:31-37

- ³¹ And again, departing from the coasts of Tyre and Sidon, he came unto the sea of Galilee, through the midst of the coasts of Decapolis.
- ³² And they bring unto him one that was deaf, and had an impediment in his speech; and they beseech him to put his hand upon him.
- ³³ And he took him aside from the multitude, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spit, and touched his tongue;
- ³⁴ And looking up to heaven, he sighed, and saith unto him, Ephphatha, that is, Be opened.
- ³⁵ And straightway his ears were opened, and the string of his tongue was loosed, and he spake plain.
- ³⁶ And he charged them that they should tell no man: but the more he charged them, so much the more a great deal they published it;
- ³⁷ And were beyond measure astonished, saying, He hath done all things well: he maketh both the deaf to hear, and the dumb to speak.

Trinity 13 (09/11/2022)

Old Testament: Ecclesiasticus 17:1-15

The Lord fashioned man from the earth and causes him to return to it again.

- ² He granted him a fixed span of days and gave him dominion over everything on earth.
- ³ He endowed him with strength like his own and made him in his own image.
- ⁴ He put the fear of him into all living things and made him the master over beasts and birds.
- [⁵ He received the use of the five faculties from the Lord; as a sixth he gave him the gift of mind, and as a seventh the gift of reason, the interpreter of one's faculties.]^[a]
- ⁶ He fashioned men's tongues, eyes, and ears and gave them minds with which to think.
- ⁷ He filled them with wisdom and understanding and a knowledge of good and evil.
- ⁸ He placed the fear of him into their hearts to display to them the majesty of his works

[9 and to enable them to proclaim his marvelous deeds][b]

- so that they may give praise to his holy name.
- ¹¹ He granted knowledge to them, endowing them with the law of life.

[Thus, they might know that those who are living are mortal.][]

- ¹² An everlasting covenant he established with them, and his decrees^[d] he revealed to them.
- ¹³ Their eyes beheld his glorious majesty, and their ears heard the glory of his voice. [e]
- ¹⁴ He said to them, "Refrain from all wrongdoing," and he gave them a commandment concerning duties toward one's neighbor.
- ¹⁵ Their ways are always known to him; they cannot be hidden from his sight.

Psalm: 118 vs 1-9

- O GIVE thanks unto the LORD, for he is gracious; * because his mercy endureth for ever.
- 2 Let Israel now confess that he is gracious, * and that his mercy endureth for ever.
- 3 Let the house of Aaron now confess, * that his mercy endureth for ever.
- 4 Yea, let them now that fear the LORD confess, * that his mercy endureth for ever.
- 5 I called upon the LORD in trouble; * and the LORD heard me at large.
- 6 The LORD is on my side; * I will not fear what man doeth unto me.

- 7 The LORD taketh my part with them that help me; * therefore shall I see my desire upon mine enemies.
- 8 It is better to trust in the LORD, * than to put any confidence in man.
- 9 It is better to trust in the LORD, * than to put any confidence in princes.

Epistle:

- ¹⁶ Now to Abraham and his seed were the promises made. He saith not, And to seeds, as of many; but as of one, And to thy seed, which is Christ.
- ¹⁷ And this I say, that the covenant, that was confirmed before of God in Christ, the law, which was four hundred and thirty years after, cannot disannul, that it should make the promise of none effect.
- ¹⁸ For if the inheritance be of the law, it is no more of promise: but God gave it to Abraham by promise.
- ¹⁹ Wherefore then serveth the law? It was added because of transgressions, till the seed should come to whom the promise was made; and it was ordained by angels in the hand of a mediator.
- ²⁰ Now a mediator is not a mediator of one, but God is one.
- ²¹ Is the law then against the promises of God? God forbid: for if there had been a law given which could have given life, verily righteousness should have been by the law.
- ²² But the scripture hath concluded all under sin, that the promise by faith of Jesus Christ might be given to them that believe.

Gospel: Luke 10:23-37

- ²³ And he turned him unto his disciples, and said privately, Blessed are the eyes which see the things that ye see:
- ²⁴ For I tell you, that many prophets and kings have desired to see those things which ye see, and have not seen them; and to hear those things which ye hear, and have not heard them.
- ²⁵ And, behold, a certain lawyer stood up, and tempted him, saying, Master, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?
- ²⁶ He said unto him, What is written in the law? how readest thou?
- ²⁷ And he answering said, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbour as thyself.

- ²⁸ And he said unto him, Thou hast answered right: this do, and thou shalt live.
- ²⁹ But he, willing to justify himself, said unto Jesus, And who is my neighbour?
- ³⁰ And Jesus answering said, A certain man went down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell among thieves, which stripped him of his raiment, and wounded him, and departed, leaving him half dead.
- ³¹ And by chance there came down a certain priest that way: and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side.
- ³² And likewise a Levite, when he was at the place, came and looked on him, and passed by on the other side.
- ³³ But a certain Samaritan, as he journeyed, came where he was: and when he saw him, he had compassion on him,
- ³⁴ And went to him, and bound up his wounds, pouring in oil and wine, and set him on his own beast, and brought him to an inn, and took care of him.
- ³⁵ And on the morrow when he departed, he took out two pence, and gave them to the host, and said unto him, Take care of him; and whatsoever thou spendest more, when I come again, I will repay thee.
- ³⁶ Which now of these three, thinkest thou, was neighbour unto him that fell among the thieves?
- ³⁷ And he said, He that shewed mercy on him. Then said Jesus unto him, Go, and do thou likewise.

Trinity 14 – 09/18/2022

Old Testament: Micah 6:1-8

6 Hear ye now what the LORD saith; Arise, contend thou before the mountains, and let the hills hear thy voice.

² Hear ye, O mountains, the LORD's controversy, and ye strong foundations of the earth: for the LORD hath a controversy with his people, and he will plead with Israel.

³ O my people, what have I done unto thee? and wherein have I wearied thee? testify against me.

⁴ For I brought thee up out of the land of Egypt, and redeemed thee out of the house of servants; and I sent before thee Moses, Aaron, and Miriam.

⁵ O my people, remember now what Balak king of Moab consulted, and what Balaam the son of Beor answered him from Shittim unto Gilgal; that ye may know the righteousness of the LORD.

⁶ Wherewith shall I come before the LORD, and bow myself before the high God? shall I come before him with burnt offerings, with calves of a year old?

⁷ Will the LORD be pleased with thousands of rams, or with ten thousands of rivers of oil? shall I give my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?

⁸ He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?

Psalm: 24 (BCP 368)

THE earth is the LORD'S, and all that therein is; * the compass of the world, and they that dwell therein.

2 For he hath founded it upon the seas, * and stablished it upon the floods.

3 Who shall ascend into the hill of the LORD? * or who shall rise up in his holy place?

4 Even he that hath clean hands, and a pure heart; * and that hath not lift up his mind unto vanity, nor sworn to deceive his neighbour.

5 He shall receive the blessing from the LORD, * and righteousness from the God of his salvation.

6 This is the generation of them that seek him; * even of them that seek thy face, O God of Jacob.

7 Lift up your heads, O ye gates; and be ye lift up, ye everlasting doors; * and the King of glory shall come in.

Epistle: Galatians 5:16-24

¹⁶ This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh.

¹⁷ For the flesh lusteth against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh: and these are contrary the one to the other: so that ye cannot do the things that ye would.

¹⁸ But if ye be led of the Spirit, ye are not under the law.

¹⁹ Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness,

²⁰ Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies,

²¹ Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God.

²² But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith,

²³ Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law.

²⁴ And they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts.

Gospel: Luke 17:11-19

¹¹ And it came to pass, as he went to Jerusalem, that he passed through the midst of Samaria and Galilee.

¹² And as he entered into a certain village, there met him ten men that were lepers, which stood afar off:

¹³ And they lifted up their voices, and said, Jesus, Master, have mercy on us.

- ¹⁴ And when he saw them, he said unto them, Go shew yourselves unto the priests. And it came to pass, that, as they went, they were cleansed.
- ¹⁵ And one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, and with a loud voice glorified God,
- ¹⁶ And fell down on his face at his feet, giving him thanks: and he was a Samaritan.
- ¹⁷ And Jesus answering said, Were there not ten cleansed? but where are the nine?
- ¹⁸ There are not found that returned to give glory to God, save this stranger.
- ¹⁹ And he said unto him, Arise, go thy way: thy faith hath made thee whole.

Trinity 15 – 09/25/2022

Old Testament: Ecclesiasticus 5:1-10

1 Set thy heart upon thy goods; and say not, I have enough for my life.

2 Follow not thine own mind and thy strength, to walk in the ways of thy heart:

3 And say not, Who shall controul me for my works? for the Lord will surely revenge thy pride.

4 Say not, I have sinned, and what harm hath happened unto me? for the Lord is longsuffering,

he will in no wise let thee go.

5 Concerning propitiation, be not without fear to add sin unto sin:

6 And say not His mercy is great; he will be pacified for the multitude of my sins: for mercy and

wrath come from him, and his indignation resteth upon sinners.

7 Make no tarrying to turn to the Lord, and put not off from day to day: for suddenly shall the

wrath of the Lord come forth, and in thy security thou shalt be destroyed, and perish in the day

of vengeance.

8 Set not thine heart upon goods unjustly gotten, for they shall not profit thee in the day of

calamity.

9 Winnow not with every wind, and go not into every way: for so doth the sinner that hath a

double tongue.

10 Be stedfast in thy understanding; and let thy word be the same.

Psalm: 1 (BCP 345)

BLESSED is the man that hath not walked in the counsel of the ungodly, nor stood in the way of

sinners, * and hath not sat in the seat of the scornful.

2 But his delight is in the law of the LORD; * and in his law will he exercise himself day and

night.

3 And he shall be like a tree planted by the water-side, * that will bring forth his fruit in due

season.

4 His leaf also shall not wither; * and look, whatsoever he doeth, it shall prosper.

5 As for the ungodly, it is not so with them; * but they are like the chaff, which the wind

scattereth away from the face of the earth.

6 Therefore the ungodly shall not be able to stand in the judgment, * neither the sinners in the congregation of the righteous.

7 But the LORD knoweth the way of the righteous; * and the way of the ungodly shall perish.

Epistle: Galatians 6:11-18

- ¹¹Ye see how large a letter I have written unto you with mine own hand.
- ¹² As many as desire to make a fair shew in the flesh, they constrain you to be circumcised; only lest they should suffer persecution for the cross of Christ.
- ¹³ For neither they themselves who are circumcised keep the law; but desire to have you circumcised, that they may glory in your flesh.
- ¹⁴ But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world.
- ¹⁵ For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision availeth any thing, nor uncircumcision, but a new creature.
- ¹⁶ And as many as walk according to this rule, peace be on them, and mercy, and upon the Israel of God.
- ¹⁷ From henceforth let no man trouble me: for I bear in my body the marks of the Lord Jesus.
- ¹⁸ Brethren, the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit. Amen.

Gospel: Matthew 6:24-34

- ²⁴ No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon.
- ²⁵ Therefore I say unto you, Take no thought for your life, what ye shall eat, or what ye shall drink; nor yet for your body, what ye shall put on. Is not the life more than meat, and the body than raiment?
- ²⁶ Behold the fowls of the air: for they sow not, neither do they reap, nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are ye not much better than they?

- ²⁷ Which of you by taking thought can add one cubit unto his stature?
- ²⁸ And why take ye thought for raiment? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they toil not, neither do they spin:
- ²⁹ And yet I say unto you, That even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these.
- ³⁰ Wherefore, if God so clothe the grass of the field, which to day is, and to morrow is cast into the oven, shall he not much more clothe you, O ye of little faith?
- ³¹ Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed?
- ³² (For after all these things do the Gentiles seek:) for your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things.
- ³³ But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.
- ³⁴ Take therefore no thought for the morrow: for the morrow shall take thought for the things of itself. Sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof.
