
To be the “best kept secret” is great for your private fishing hole, or the cozy restaurant that has yet to be discovered by our winter visitors. It is not such a great achievement for a church. The truth is that most people are unfamiliar with the Anglican Church. In fact, I do get more than a few questions about whether we are a church just for Anglos, or if we are a spin off from Mother Angelica's show on Roman Catholic television. The truth is that the Anglican Church traces its roots back to the 70 disciples sent out by Jesus to proclaim his word, and has continued as a scripturally based, sacramental church from the time of the Apostles to our own time. Worldwide, there are 10's of millions of Anglicans, including the British Commonwealth, Africa, and Asia.

In the United States, the Episcopal Church was established as the Anglican Church for newly independent colonies when we became the United States. However, beginning in the 1950's, as the Episcopal Church started to turn away from its belief in the Bible as the Word of God, and began to modernize its service, and follow the more liberal and less traditional beliefs of modern culture, a group of faithful followers began the continuing Anglican Church in the United States to preserve the practice of the faith as it was delivered from Apostolic times and is practiced still around the world.

St. Patrick's is proud to be a continuing Anglican Church, but we are ready to give up our status as a “best kept secret”. We have started a series of classes at 9:00 AM on Sunday mornings to explain the History, tradition, beliefs, and practice of the Anglican Church.
