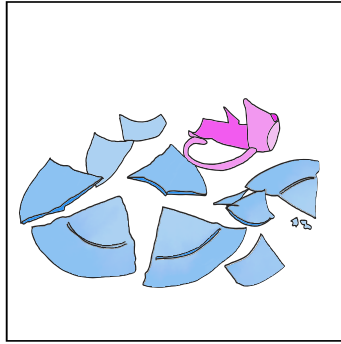


New Years around the world

In Spain, they eat 12 grapes, because it represents good luck for each month of the new year



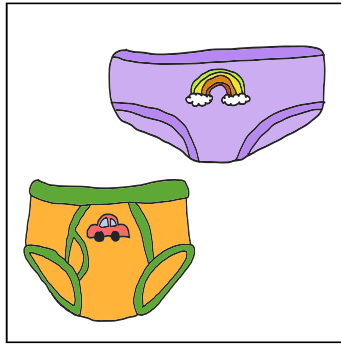
In Denmark, they throw old plates and glasses against the doors to banish bad spirits



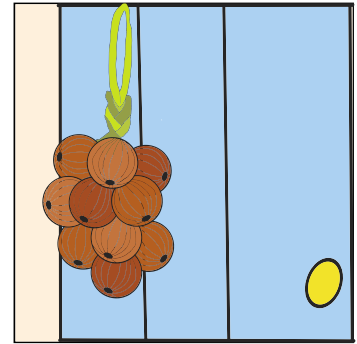
In Columbia, they carry empty suitcases around the block.

What is Winter

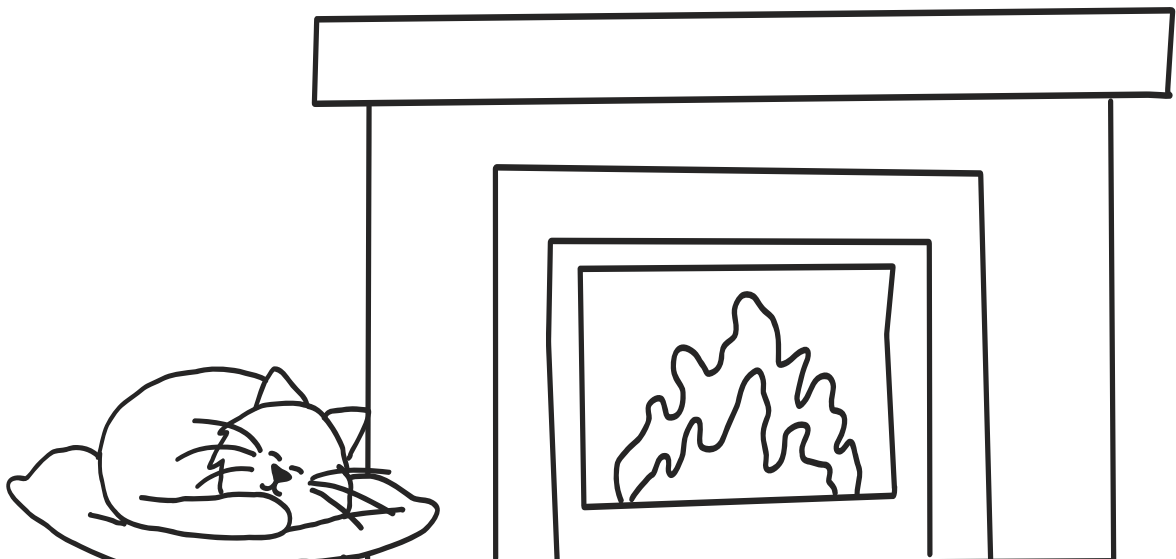
Winter is one of the four seasons. It is the coldest time of the year. In the Northern Hemisphere it begins in December and ends in February. In the Southern Hemisphere it starts in June and ends in August.

Winter is the season that comes after autumn and before spring in the cycle of the seasons. Depending on where you live, it often brings with it colder weather and shorter days. Because it sits between autumn and spring, winter can be seen as the direct opposite of summer.

Many changes can be observed in plants, as the trees don't have leaves anymore. Animals big and small, like bears and mice hibernate to stay warm and survive the cold weather, while others migrate to warmer countries to escape the cold.

Some places get lots of snow and ice during the winter.

People warm up with hot chocolates and fireplaces, fluffy socks and extra blankets. How do you warm up when you are cold?

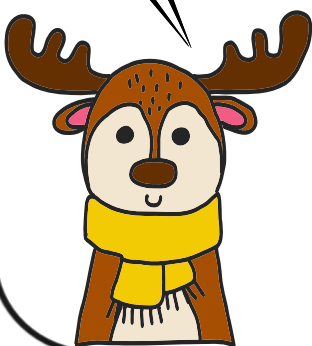
