

Directions for Student Video Submission

One way in which $Capture\ Thought^{\circledR}$ is intended to be used is a tool that allows you to demonstrate depth of knowledge and communicate your understanding of a concept. This in turn allows me as your teacher to give you customized, documented and accurate feedback. To achieve this goal, it's important to follow the directions for submitting a video to Canvas. Videos submitted to Canvas will not have a grade attached, instead you will receive feedback based on what you submit. In addition, you will also be building your own personal math portfolio documenting your growth and achievements over the year.

1. Set Up & Record

- ✓ Set up your Capture Thought stand in a quiet space and set your phone to record a video.
- ✓ Place your phone with the screen side up on top of your Capture Thought stand. Be sure you are using the camera that faces down toward the ground.
- ✓ Before recording, practice as many times as you need to on the mini white board until you feel fully ready to communicate your understanding to the best of your ability.
- ✓ When you are ready to record, place the paper handout under your phone and check that the camera is properly pointing at the paper.
- ✓ Tap record on your phone and remember to *talk through your entire video* using proper mathematical language. When you're done, tap the record button to stop recording.
- ✓ Remember to show exactly what you are trying to say in your video, don't skip any steps. I want to know what you're thinking because this will allow me to give you better feedback.
- ✓ Keep your video *under 2 minutes*.

2. Minor Editing

- ✓ Be sure your video is oriented the right way. You may need to flip your video upside down.
- ✓ The new iOS update (13.1) allows you to crop and flip your screen directly after you record. Try to crop out any unnecessary screen footage. Be sure to save any edits.

3. Name & Save

- ✓ When you are finished recording and are ready to upload to YouTube, save your video in the following way.
- ✓ CT Subject Chapter First Initial Last Name For example: CT Derivatives CH2 JDiOrio
- ✓ This will make finding a specific video very easy and will help you stay organized.

4. Uploading to YouTube

- ✓ Open the YouTube app on your phone and upload your video directly. You do this by taping the solid movie camera button in the top right corner on the home page of the app.
- ✓ Select the video you just recorded and tap next.
- ✓ The Title of the video should be named according to step 3.
- ✓ I recommend you make your videos Unlisted. This means that only people with the link will be able to view it, however you are welcome to make them public if you like.

5. Submitting to Canvas

Once your video has been uploaded to YouTube, it can be shared via a link that YouTube creates for you. From the app, tap Library in the lower left corner then My Videos. Find your video then tap the three vertical dots in the right corner. Tap Share, then Copy Link. Once you have copied the sharable link to your clipboard, sign into Canvas and click on the assignment link. Choose the assignment then paste your link under the submit tab. That's it!
