WHO WE ARE



United Natives is a national nonprofit founded in 2017 to advance health equity, mental wellness, and opportunity across Native communities through trusted partnerships, culturally grounded programs, and innovative technology.

Founded by **Dr. Crystal Lee, PhD, MPH, MLS** (Navajo Nation): 1-of-5 Native American infectious disease researchers in the U.S., Assistant Professor at University of New Mexico College of Population Health, named by Scientific American as 1-of-3 people changing health equity in America.

United Natives operates nationally, working alongside tribes, Tribal 638 clinics, Indian Health Services (IHS) partners, professional sports organizations, universities, and public and private institutions to deliver scalable, community-driven health solutions.

SOCIAL CHALLENGES TO HEALTH CARE & INFORMATION



75% of Natives live in urban areas, only 1% of Indian Health Services (IHS) funding goes to urban health



- Poverty rates paired with poor housing conditions**
- Higher rates of violence and homicide**
- Limited or no access to healthy food sources**
- Insufficient water, plumbing, and electricity on reservations**
- Substance use disorder stigma within communities**
- Lack of broadband and internet access**

WHO THE APP SERVES

- Individuals (NA/AN users)
- Tribal governments & clinics
- Urban Indian health organizations
- Researchers & policymakers
- Organizations seeking meaningful engagement with Native communities
- Academic institutions

PROJECTED GROWTH TO NEW USERS

Conservative adoption (pilot + early rollout)

- Year 1 (0.5%): $10,000,000 \times 0.005 = 50,000$ users
- Year 2 (1.5%): $10,000,000 \times 0.015 = 150,000$ users
- Year 3 (3.0%): $10,000,000 \times 0.03 = 300,000$ users

Moderate adoption (strong partner onboarding + steady growth)

- Year 1 (1%): $10,000,000 \times 0.01 = 100,000$ users
- Year 2 (3%): $10,000,000 \times 0.03 = 300,000$ users
- Year 3 (6%): $10,000,000 \times 0.06 = 600,000$ users

Ambitious adoption (major institutional partnerships + national campaigns)

- Year 1 (2%): $10,000,000 \times 0.02 = 200,000$ users
- Year 2 (6%): $10,000,000 \times 0.06 = 600,000$ users
- Year 3 (12%): $10,000,000 \times 0.12 = 1,200,000$ users
