### THE REVEREND'S RAMBLINGS

April 22 is Earth Day, which is probably not a holiday most of us celebrate. But I think it's a good opportunity for us to evaluate our responsibility to our planet. Unfortunately, talking about the environment these days has become one of those topics hijacked by our current political discourse. We seem to be able to only have this conversation through the lens of "liberal" or "conservative." I lament that trend, for we need to reflect on our relationship to the environment as God's people.

Chief among this is the quality of stewardship. Simply put, stewardship is how you and I allocate the good things God has given us. And I believe how we take care of the natural world is a huge part of that. Some Christians interpret the Bible to mean that God gave humans the Earth to exploit it for their own use. I disagree. I think God put humans in the garden to tend it. In this sense, humans have been given a precious task that goes all the way back to Adam and Eve. But it is frustrating how lightly we seem to take that responsibility. We in the church talk about the sanctity of life but we fail to see how our use of the earth's resources contributes to global poverty and war.

Of course, it's sometimes hard to imagine how we can make a difference. But I think we can do things on a small scale, and those things matter. One of the virtues we have lost in our modern world is thrift. We throw more things away than any other people in history. We waste. We use single-use plastic all the time and then toss it into the trash, without considering that it will still be around in hundreds of years. Even at our church, it astonishes me how often I see a plastic bottle or aluminum can thrown into the garbage directly beside a recycling bin.

In other words, we're lazy. You and I live in a disposable culture where we are used to things that are cheap and easy. The idea that we should take better care of our world and each other is hard to learn and harder to practice. But that is the core of stewardship. It's a recognition that the world matters because God created it to be good and beautiful. And our participation in caring for the world bears witness to that holiness. So this Earth Day, may we all consider how we can do our part as God's stewards.
