SERMON TEXTS FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH March 5 Romans 5:12-19 March 12 Nicole Farrar Preaching March 19 Romans 6:5-23 March 26 I Corinthians 1:17-31

During the season of Lent, Aaron will be preaching a series of sermons entitled the Cruciform Church, as we think about how the cross shapes our life together as the body of Christ.

THE REVEREND'S RAMBLINGS

"At the cross, at the cross where I first saw the light, and the burden of my heart rolled away." Like many of you, I grew up singing that hymn and others about the power of the cross. And the cross has become ubiquitous in our culture. We see them beside the road, on giant billboards or tacked onto trees. Businesses use them to advertise. Just in our sanctuary alone, we have three or four crosses.

But despite all their proximity, we still don't really talk about the cross all that much in church. Why is the cross the central symbol of our faith (and not for example, the bread and the cup)? That is what I want us to explore together during this season of Lent. Sometimes, it's easy to get caught up in everything else and miss the most central thing. And I worry we've lost sight of the cross. You and I treat the crucifixion as a historical event, i.e. "Jesus died for our sins." That's true enough. But how does the cross continue to shape our lives in the here and now? Does it? If so, what would that begin to look like?

So much of our theology in the church is geared towards orthodoxy—right thinking. That's important. But orthopraxy is also essential—right action. So during this next 40 days, I want us to think about not just what the cross means (as if we could ever fully understand that), but also how the cross impacts our behavior. I believe that what Jesus does on the cross changed something about us and the world forever. And I hope that during this Lenten season, we can begin to experience that transformation within our congregation. I'm excited for this journey ahead!
