THE REVEREND'S RAMBLINGS

The presidential election is almost upon us and one comment that I hear quite frequently is—"I don't like any of my choices." Maybe a few folks on either side whole-heartedly support one candidate or the other but most seem disappointed and torn about their options. That seems to be a common state of affairs these days. And there's a few conclusions I would draw from that experience as we try to be God's people together.

First, I would advise all of us to be gentle and open-minded when dealing with people who are voting differently than us. I know some folks who have strong opinions. They say, "Well, if you're a Christian, you simply must vote for X." But I tend to agree with Pope Francis, who made the comment recently that neither candidate for president really lines up neatly with the positions of Jesus. You say, "But Pastor, what about abortion?" And it's true, one candidate supports abortion rights while the other (somewhat half-heartedly) opposes them. But being pro-life is about so much more than abortion. It's about how those children will be fed and clothed and educated after they are born. It's about protecting them from gun violence. It's about welcoming the stranger. It's about making sure people have access to health care. There are all sorts of positions that candidates take which may or may not play into our calling as followers of Christ. And I for one do not believe it is as simple as reducing it down to one issue.

So whenever I hear somebody who is voting for the other candidate, I do not condemn them as evil or ignorant. I do not make disparaging comments about them or question whether they are truly Christian. I try to grant them the same respect I wish to be given, which is an assumption that they are making the best choice they can based on their prayers and their faith. That mutual respect has almost totally eroded in our current society. And it may give us moral satisfaction to belittle those with whom we disagree. But at the very least, even if we do not agree on a candidate, we in the church can model a civil way of interacting with one another. The choices may not be great but we can show the world a different way of living when we are united around the only One who truly offers us hope—Jesus.
