During September, Aaron will be preaching a series of sermons from the book of Ephesians on how Christ works in our lives.

THE REVEREND'S RAMBLINGS

One of the on-going projects of my ministry is helping us to engage the Bible more completely. By completely, I mean not only learning more about it, but allowing it to transform us. I remain convinced that the Bible is uniquely powerful and relevant for our lives today. Unfortunately, the Bible is also long, strange, and boring. And those barriers often prove to be hard to overcome for those who wish to engage the Bible more deeply.

So beginning this month and continuing throughout the fall on Wednesday nights, I will be leading a session I'm entitling Bible Boot Camp. This session is for anyone, from the person who knows next to nothing about the Bible to the one who thinks they're an expert. In fact, I think some of us who have grown up in the church often struggle with learning from the Bible because we assume we already know what it says. No matter our level of knowledge, my hope is that Bible Boot Camp will help us think and grow faithfully in new ways. The intention is to peel away some of the obstacles which prevent us from understanding and yes, even enjoying, the Bible. During Bible Boot Camp, we will carefully go through the different sections of the text, discussing genre, themes, and historical context. We will learn more about how and why the Bible was edited into its current format and how that changes the way we read it. We will look at some of the most familiar passages as well as some that are more obscure, but the focus will not be on individual stories as much as the big picture: Why do we call this book holy? Why do we continue to study it and preach from it? Are there better ways to read it? If you've ever wanted to learn more about the Bible or if you're simply interested in gaining a new perspective, Bible Boot Camp is for you. Come enlist with us.

BIBLE BOOT CAMP

Beginning on Wednesday, September 15 and continuing for eight weeks, we will undertake "Bible Boot Camp." This will be a basic overview of the whole Bible, how to read it, and what to do with it. We will begin each week at 5:30pm. Bring your own dinner and your favorite translation of the Bible. We will eat first then begin our study afterwards. Let's see if you have what it takes to undergo Bible Boot Camp!



We have wrapped up 9 awesome weeks of camp! We had 84 different campers with us this summer, and that is not including our daycare side! We are thankful for each camper, and hope they made some amazing memories this year. One of our favorite weeks was Shark Week! September 7th, we kick off our 2021-2022 school year. UPDATED COVID GUIDELINES

Because of the rising case numbers in our area from COVID, including positive tests from those within our congregation, Talbot Park Baptist Church will immediately implement the following protocols:
