The Ralph H. Johnson VA Medical Center in Charleston was recently named as one of the top 25 Environmental Excellence Award winners by Practice Greenhealth, the nation's leading organization dedicated to environ-mental sustainability

in health care. Practice Greenhealth recognizes U.S. health care facilities that exemplify the highest standards in envi-ronmental practices.

On August 21st 2017, Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) Secretary Dr. David J. Shulkin announced that VA plans to propose changes to regulations for its State Veterans Home Construction Grant Program to make it easier to for States to receive VA funding to construct Veterans homes in rural areas.

On August 11th, 2017 the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs announced that the two-month pilot phase of the new White House VA Hotline that began in June has demonstrated that Veterans calling the hotline respond best when their calls are answered by fellow Veterans and others with first-hand experience on their issues. Youth Scholarships and Activities Patriot's Pen - Voice of Democracy

Voice of Democracy Audio/Essay Contest. Since 1947, the VFW has asked high school students to write and record a 3 - 5 minute essay, again on a patriotic theme selected by the

VFW each year. Students may record on an audio CD or flash drive. Like Patriot's Pen, Voice of Democracy winners receive scholarships and other incentives at the Post, District, and Department and finally to the National level where they will compete for the \$30,000 first place scholarship. The Voice of Democracy theme for this year is "American History: Our Hope for the Future."

Originally created as the Youth Essay Contest, Patriot's Pen asks junior high and middle school students to write a 300-400 word essay on a new patriotic theme each



year. Winners receive scholarships and begin by competing at the Post level. Winners proceed to District, Department and finally to the National level where they compete for the \$5,000 first place scholarship. The Patriot's Pen theme for this year is "America's Gift to My Generation."

These two great youth scholarship programs provide over \$3 million in scholarships and incentives every year.

<u>Did you know:</u> Traditionally, members of the nation's veteran's service organizations have rendered the hand-salute during the national anthem and at events involv-



ing the national flag only while wearing their organization's official head-gear.

The National Defense Authorization Act of 2008 contained an amendment to allow un-uniformed service members, military retirees, and veterans to render a hand salute during the hoisting, lowering, or passing of the U.S. flag.

A later amendment further authorized hand-salutes during the national anthem by veterans and out-of-uniform military personnel. This was included in the Defense Authorization Act of 2009, which

President Bush signed on Oct. 14, 2008.

Here is the actual text from the law:

SEC. 595. MILITARY SALUTE FOR THE FLAG DURING THE NATIONAL ANTHEM BY MEM-BERS OF THE ARMED FORCES NOT IN UNIFORM AND BY VETERANS.

Section 301(b) (1) of title 36, United States Code, is amended by striking subparagraphs (A) through (C) and inserting the following new subparagraphs:

(A) Individuals in uniform should give the military salute at the first note of the anthem and maintain that position until the last note;

(B) Members of the Armed Forces and veterans who are present but not in uniform may render the military salute in the manner provided for individuals in uniform; and

(C) All other persons present should face the flag and stand at attention with their right hand over the heart, and men not in uniform, if applicable, should remove their headdress with their right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart;

Note: Part (C) applies to those not in the military and non-veterans. The phrase "men not in uniform" refers to civil service uniforms like police, fire fighters, and letter carriers - non-veteran civil servants who might normally render a salute while in uniform.
