Hello Comrades! Dare I say "Happy February"? With a month that has so much to offer; Valentines Day, Presidents Day, a short month for retirees, even Groundhog Day it certainly has started off badly. As of this writing we are in the midst of a "government shutdown" and a flu pandemic.

Let me take the "Shutdown" first. With assistance from Representative Sanford's Office I



can report the following. Social Security, Medicare, Military Retiree, checks will go out as usual. Essential government services such as military services (active duty), border protection, air traffic control, and law enforcement will continue. The Veterans Health Administration will continue full operation. The Ralph H. Johnson VA Medical Center and all Community Based Outpatient Clinics are operating under normal hours. All is not business as normal though. Fort Sumter and Fort Moultrie

are both closed. Most government agencies will see some change in normal operations. How much change will depend on the mission and duties of that specific government agency. For example: The IRS verifies income and social security numbers for mortgage and loan applicants. It is likely those services will stop thus delaying loan and mortgage applications until the shutdown is resolved. If you have questions either call the government involved, or Representative Sanford's office at Phone: (843) 352-7572 or Fax: (843) 352-7620.

Now about the flu pandemic. Take it from someone that knows first hand... The flu vaccine that many of us took in a timely manner does not work against the current variation of the flu. After a trip to an "Urgent Care" Facility and then a subsequent trip to the MUSC ER I was told the current vaccine was only about 10% effective. Consequently medical facilities everywhere are swamped. The Ralph Johnson

VAMC is open. But, it has put out this current directive. "Patients experiencing flu symptoms, such as fever/chills, runny nose, muscle aches, sore throat, coughing and/or sneezing, are encouraged to call the VA's Telephone Advice Program (TAP) line at 843-789-6400 or 888-878-6884 prior to presenting in person to the medical center. Only Veteran patients and immediate family should visit the medical center; no children under the age of 12 at this time. Wash your hands with soap and water or alcohol-based hand cleaner before and after each visit. Cover your cough or sneeze. Masks are available at the medical center's entrances and should be used by those who suspect they may have the flu."

Comrades as always, if you see a veteran in need... help them! Together we will get through this.

Surgeon's Corner



The flu season is more deadly this year with more hospitalizations and deaths. If you haven't gotten your flu vaccine, it is not too late. There is no recommendation that a second will make you any more protected. Drink plenty of water and non-caffeinated drinks. You may not be aware of how dehydrating you get in the winter.

February is heart month. Take care of yours with the proper diet and exercise.

In the wake of the nation's opioid crisis, expect to have to tolerate more pain. Many doctors are now not trying to go pain-free, but to make your pain manageable. They are prescribing less meds in hopes of preventing opioid addiction.

Hurricane Maria's effect on Puerto Rico's manufacturing of IV bags has left the US hospitals shorts of available intravenous fluids. Expect to drink more and to take more medications orally that were once readily provided by IV.

If you have cold symptoms, wear a mask in public, or better yet stay at home and rest. Wash your hands regularly with soap and warm water, and use hand sanitizers frequently.

VFW Delivers Petition Urging Congress to Expand VA Caregiver Program

The VFW, Disabled American Veterans, The American Legion and Paralyzed Veterans of America joined forces in support of pre-9/11 caregivers who are unjustly denied access to the comprehensive caregiver services VA provides the caregivers of post-9/11 veterans. Together, they delivered a petition with more than 182,000 signatures calling on Congress to expand VA comprehensive caregiver assistance benefits to disabled veterans of all eras. They were joined by Senate and House members also calling on their colleagues to pass caregiver extension legislation. "Caregivers of military veterans, the overwhelming majority of whom are family members, put their lives and careers on hold, often accepting great emotional and financial burdens to ensure their veterans have a meaningful quality of life and stay in their homes instead of having to receive institutional nursing home care," said Bob Wallace, VFW's Assistant Adjutant General and Executive Director, Washington Office. VFW Opposes New VA Privatization Attempt

Congressman Doug Lamborn (R-Colo.) recently introduced a bill that would break our promise to veterans. H.R. 4457, the Veterans Empowerment Act, would dismantle the VA health care system, charge veterans for service-connected health care, and reduce VA to an insurance program for veterans. Congressman Lamborn and bill cosponsors, Congressmen Mark Meadows (R-N.C.) and Trent Franks (R-Ariz.), must not be allowed to advance this dangerous proposal. Urge your member of Congress to oppose H.R. 4457 and let Congress know if they cannot take care of America's veterans, then Congress should quit creating them. Click here to take action!


