Hello Comrades. I want to remind you of a few quick and easy ways to contact the Veterans Administration directly or a local Veteran Service Officer if you need assistance.

The easiest was to contact the Veterans Administration directly is by calling 1-844-698-2311. You will hear a menu of options that you can select from to route you to the right place depending on your inquiry. Some areas that often have inquires are Benefits: 1-800-827-1000, Health Care: 1-877-222-8387, VA Inspector General: 1-800-488-8244, and

Veterans Crisis Line: 1-800-273-8255 Press 1.

In South Carolina each County has a Veterans' Affairs Office. These are under the State of South Carolina Division of Veteran's Affairs, not the United States Department of Veterans Affairs (Federal Government). But, these County offices with years of knowledge and experience can be a valuable local resource in dealing with the Federal VA. Some local County offices and their numbers are; Berkeley 843-377-8506, Charleston 843-974-6360, and Dorchester 843-832-0050.

Of course the internet is also a quick painless source of information. In any event, if you have a question... ASK! The information is free and it may not only benefit you, but your family as well.


