Hello comrades. This post is lengthy. But it helps you to understand the oversight the VA is continually subjected to every day.

This month's information that is about a recent finding of the Government Accountability Office (GAO) as it pertains to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). The GAO placed VA on its "**High-Risk List**." The move is designed to address lingering deficiencies in its health-care system once and for all. The GAO identified five specific risk areas when

it added VA health care to the Federal government's list of 32 high-risk agencies and programs in 2015: ambiguous policies and inconsistent processes, inadequate oversight and accountability, information technology challenges, inadequate training for VA staff, and unclear resource needs and allocation priorities

The GAO is an independent, nonpartisan agency that works for Congress. Often called the "congressional watchdog," GAO investigates how the federal government spends taxpayer dollars. It's **mission** is to support the Congress in meeting its constitutional responsibilities and to help improve the performance and ensure the accountability of the federal government for the benefit of the American people. Every two years, GAO calls attention to agencies and program areas that are high risk as a result of vulnerabilities and in need of transformation.

In response to being placed on the High Risk List, the VA recently delivered a comprehensive action plan to GAO that includes these crucial steps the agency has taken to address these risk areas for VA health care, along with a number of others to improve business operations:

- **Reducing ambiguity and red tape**. Eliminated outdated policy documents. VA has already purged more than 235 expired directives and 85 percent of all outdated manuals.
- **Eliminating bureaucracy and streamlining decision making**. VA has reduced central office staff positions by 10 percent and consolidated its policy and operations functions in mental health, primary care, and geriatrics to improve support to field activities and Veteran-facing services. These restructuring actions allow VA to become more efficient by pushing decision rights to the lowest appropriate level.
- **Strengthening internal oversight and accountability**. The Veterans Health Administration (VHA) established the Office of Integrity to consolidate its compliance, ethics, and oversight programs under a single executive, and moved swiftly to establish an internal audit function and associated governance committee that provides the Under Secretary for Health with an independent and objective way to assess operations.
- **Modernizing information technology support.** VA's Electronic Health Record (EHR) Modernization program will enable seamless care and full interoperability with the Department of Defense's EHR modernization solution, and enhance the ability to exchange Veteran health data with community health partners.
- **Clarifying resource needs and priorities**. VA established a centralized manpower management office to integrate staffing processes, and transformed its financial management methods to improve resource planning and allocation.

In addition to addressing the GAO high-risk areas, VA continually responds to GAO recommendations on VA operations throughout each year. Overall, VA has succeeded in closing approximately 377 recommendations since 2009, and is committed to closing as quickly as possible all 22 recommendations that GAO has identified as high priority. So even with the current turmoil with the VA Director position, the VA is being monitored and watched to insure the very best care for our Veterans

VFW Patriotic Youth Scholarship Contest Opens

Every year, students compete for their share of \$3 million in scholarships and awards Dedicated to encouraging a better understanding and appreciation of America, the VFW's Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen essay competitions help foster patriotism among today's youth. The programs also foster friendly competition as well as rewards success in the form of some \$3 million in scholarship monies being distributed.



The Voice of Democracy theme for 2018-19 asks high school students to reflect on <u>*"Why My Vote Matters."*</u> The audio-essay competition is open to all students in grades 9-12, with the top prize being a \$30,000 scholarship award. Nearly 40,000 high school students complete in the annual competition.



The Patriot's Pen essay competition is open to all students in grades 6-8, and the 2018 -19 competition asks students to examine the statement, <u>"Why I Honor the Ameri-</u> <u>can Flag."</u> The first-place winner will receive a \$5,000 award. More than 132,000 students competed in this year's Patriot's Pen competition.


