The Emissions Savings of a Nuclear Power Station in Germany

Each nuclear reactor saves around 10m tonnes of CO2 emissions annually:

Gross power production in 2018 in TWh:

146 lignite83 coal83 natural gas5 oilTotal from fossil fuels: 317 TWh

Total from nuclear: 76 TWh

Nuclear power generation as a proportion of fossil fuel power generation: (76/317) x 100 = 24%

Power generation from CO2 emitting sources in energy sector (= fossil fuels, biomass & waste) in 2018: 317 + 45 + 6 = 368 TWh


Fossil fuel power generation as a proportion of power generation from CO2 emitting sources in energy sector: $(317/368) \times 100 = 86\%$

Emissions of energy sector in 2018: 299m tonnes CO2

Emissions of energy sector attributable to fossil fuels in 2018: 86% x 299 = 257m tonnes CO2


Projected boost to emissions of fossil fuels if nuclear power (six power stations) wholly replaced by additional fossil fuels: 24% x 257 = 62m tonnes CO2


Annual savings attributable to each nuclear power station: 62 / 6 = 10.3m tonnes CO2
