Community Safety and Awareness Message

The Maple Lake Security Council received the following message from Sheriff Matheny Saturday June 29th.

"I don't know if you noticed the action last night at 974 Maple Lake Road, at the Rick Sharp residents, but just to let you know that local, state and federal law enforcement executed a Search warrant and found a large amount of illegal drugs. The Drug Task Force will present indictments in the very near future against the owner and an organization of people from Detroit, Michigan who were responsible for this illicit operation. The purpose of this message is to ask you to help me get a word of thanks out to your community. Over the last several months we have received numerous tips and calls about this address. In fact, most of that information was used in the affidavit for the search warrant and is vital to this investigation. Names or any other identifying information on residents who provided information will be kept strictly confidential. Please let the good people of the Maple Lake Community know how very much we appreciated their assistance as well as their patience. This take down is significant in our continued efforts in ridding our country of illegal drugs. Thank you!"

Special 4th of July Lake Side Reminders

- Traffic travels in one direction at the lake on the Fourth of July. When you enter the lake you will only be able to turn to the right traveling around the lake and leaving the lake in one direction only. The lake becomes extremely busy with members, families, and guests.
- Please remember to drive slowly. The posted speed limit of 25 MPH is NOT appropriate for the Lake on July 4th. Watch for children (and adults) crossing the road.
- If you haven't been to the Lake on the Fourth of July, be prepared for a noisy afternoon and evening. While Maple Lake Club does not provide a fire works show, many lake members provide their own fire works shows as the evening progresses. Please do this carefully and abide by as many rules/laws as possible. Safety is extremely important during this and all holiday events.
- With legal (and illegal) fireworks available, Lake Members and their guest need to refrain from setting off fireworks on lake property. Please be respectful of your neighbors and have a safe, fun 4th of July Celebrations
- Maple Lake members are reminded that absolutely nothing except toilet paper can be flushed into the sewage system. Even if a product such as wipes or feminine items say flushable, they will do damage to our sewage systems.
