Supporting Conejo Schools

Today's speaker was Lana Clark, the Executive Director (and sole full-time employee) of the Conejo Schools Foundation (CSF). The Foundation is a private non-profit whose mission is to sup-

port student success throughout the Conejo Valley Unified School District (CVUSD). She likened it to a District-wide PTA.

Lana shared a wide variety of ways the Foundation accomplishes its mission. One means is through making grants to teachers every year. In 2024, CSF made grants to 285 teachers in the total amount of \$77,000, its largest grant cycle ever. CSF also partners with the Chamber of Commerce to present a "Teacher of the Month" award in their classroom.

A project that Lana is particularly proud of is All-District Music Festival. CSF partners with CVUSD and the Conejo Recreation and Park District to bring together 3,600 students for musical performances at the Kavli Theater.

CSF supports students who are unhoused or underhoused with the donation of backpacks and school supplies and items from the "Conejo Closet, a collection of clothes and basic supplies that

are available throughout the year. Lana told us that 700 children qualify for this type of support.

CSF gets it funding through private donations from individual donors and from grants, including from the City of Thousand Oaks. Lana also expressed appreciation for the way non-profits here work together to address community needs, rather than competing for donor support.
