Free Clinic Serves Valley

Vice President Kathy Smiley introduced our speakers, Sarah Hawkins and Deborah Kahn, both with CFS certifications. They came to tell us about the extent of help that the Conejo Valley Free Clinic provides to those in need. Sarah shared that losing her mother to cancer moved her to want to serve the community in this way.

I loved how clear their slides were. They told us about all the disciplines that are included with free services in Medical, Dental and Legal.

The Clinic has been helping us for 50 years. They help both local and Los Angeles County with free services. They have 130 volunteers to accomplish so much good.

One of the challenges for a non-profit

is having money to run the greatness. They shared that are funded privately, and not with Government grants that are drying up all over the place. They gave a shout out to Robin Britt and Community Conscience for putting a free roof over their heads in the Human Services Center at 80 E. Hillcrest Drive – so valuable. AND they are about to build out into a twin space, so they'll grow by 1,000 square feet

Looking at their business model, they help people on a "first time in a long time" basis, doing testing and physicals. As needed, they have medical and dental professionals who step in and take the patients through what is needed. The Free Clinic also educates folks on other services they can take advantage of.

Our speakers had a great story of how the two lawyers at the clinic (10 years of service) saved a woman's home, when she was hit by fraud. Yea!

They are open to both support and volunteering. Now we know Sarah and Debbie, if you want to have a private chat about ways you can help.

Kathy thanked our two speakers, handed them beautiful Kiwanis coffee mugs, and posed with them for a picture.

With that, Brian rang the bell and closed our meeting.


