Committee Reports and Announcements



Fire Safety Now

Vice President Kathy Smiley introduced Jim and Stacie Roth from the Ventura Regional Fire Safe Council.

Their Mission Statement: "It is a grassroots community- led organization that mobilizes residents to protect their homes, communities, and environments from catastrophic wildfire, through collaborative planning, programs, mitigation and education."

Jim shared with us that structural and vegetation modifications can reduce wildfire risks up to 75%. This organization will provide an official to come to your home free of charge and analyze possible hazards. Any change would be up to you. However, home insurance/fire insurance is tightening restrictions quickly. The more you can get done, a little at a time, could save you headaches (and homelessness) in the future.

Keeping vegetation (plants, bushes) at least five feet away from your house and other structures is important. Wood fences and patio covers close to the house can ignite quickly. Overhanging tree branches or growth too close to the house poses a threat.

House structural weaknesses could be found in faulty roofing, leaf filled gutters, big vent screen openings. To deter embers that can travel over a mile from wildfires, vent screen openings should be no larger than 1/8th of an inch. Anyone want to climb on my roof and investigate? No, I should request a free Home Wildfire Assessment.
